Annual Report

The Flinders Council 2012-13 Annual Report was accepted at the Annual General Meeting on 6th December and can be accessed on the Council's website or a hard copy obtained from the Council Office. I commend Staff on the report's professional presentation and very readable format.

Steam Weeder

Council is now using a Steam Weed machine to manage weeds in town areas. There are no chemicals involved with this process and mist will not damage garden plants. The Steam Weeder has been used for a year now and whilst not as efficient as using spray, the extra cost is considered worthwhile for use in the town areas.

TasWater

TasWater is the new single entity that is responsible for servicing Tasmanian communities with water and sewerage and is responsible for the non-potable water supplies to Whitemark and Lady Barron. As reported by the Editor in the last edition of Island News, TasWater is investigating ways to upgrade these to potable supplies. Whilst services throughout Tasmania are not currently charged at the same rates (result of the different rates previously charged by the 29 Councils that now own TasWater) there is a transition process in place to postage stamp pricing which will see consistent pricing across the State in the years ahead.

Community Rose Garden

I recommend a visit to the Rose Garden beside the Library, the display is magnificent and an absolute credit to the community members and staff who tend it.

Summer Residents - Visitors

A reminder to visitors that registration on the Electoral Roll is used as a proof of Tasmanian residency for the Tasmanian Ambulance service that is funded by the State Government for Tasmanian residents and for eligibility for the Patient Transport Assistance Scheme (PTAS) should you be referred to Launceston for medical reasons.

Dogs

Reminder to dog owners you must be in control of your dog when it is in a public area. Dogs are not allowed inside any business premises or areas where food is being served, even if on a leash. Reports of dogs roaming at will, may trigger a visit to the island from the Dog Control Officer, a cost to you and your fellow ratepayers. Fines are also applicable.

Your enjoyment of your dog should not be at someone else's expense or discomfort.

Reduce Fuel Loads Now!

Now is the time that residents and property owners should be reducing the fuel load around buildings. A concerted effort now, will benefit both you and your neighbours.

GRANTS

There are currently a variety grants available that may be applicable to local community groups and organisations. Below are a list of the grants and their links for you to have a look at. If you have an idea or project we suggest you contact the funding body to discuss your eligibility and application.

1. Aboriginal Benefits Foundation www.aboriginal.org.au/grants

Grant Applications are considered by the board of the foundation at each directors meeting. The board currently meets approximately 6-8 times per year.

2. First Home Owners Grant (FHOG) and First Home Builder Boost (FHBB) www.sro.tas.gov.au Applicants can receive \$7,000 for the FHOG for a new or established dwelling including a house, flat, unit, townhouse or apartment anywhere in Tasmania that meets local planning standards. The existing \$8,000 First Home Builder Boost (the Boost) has been increased to \$23,000. The new Boost applies to eligible applicants with contracts entered into between these dates 7th November 2013 and 31st December 2014.

3. Sport and Rec 2013-14 Minor Grants Program

Through the Minor Grants Program (MGP), Sport and Recreation

Tasmania (SRT) provides financial assistance to organisations towards equipment purchases and the development/improvement of facilities or playing surfaces that directly benefit sport and active recreation clubs. Round Two - Applications close Wednesday 15th January 2014.

4. Arts Tasmania Offers Funding Programs www.arts.tas.gov.au

There are a range of grant opportunities available through Arts Tasmania at different times throughout the year.

5. 26 TEN Grants Program www.skills.tas.gov.au

The Program supports employers and peak bodies to increase the literacy and numeracy skills of Tasmanian workers (paid and voluntary). Applicants can apply for a grant of up to \$50,000. There are two levels of funding: Tier 1 \$5,000 - \$20,000 and Tier 2 \$20,001 - \$50,000. Applications for 2013/2014 funding round are open and closes on 27th March 2014.

6. The No Interest Micro-Business Loan program

The Program provides small, interestfree loans of up to \$3,000 to people on low incomes. The program is delivered in Tasmania by the No Interest Loans Scheme (NILS).

7. Local Sporting Champions www.ausport.gov.au

The Local Sporting Champions Program is an Australian Government initiative designed to provide financial assistance for young people aged 12-18 towards the cost of travel, accommodation, uniforms or equipment when competing, coaching or officiating at an official National



Sporting Organisation (NSO) endorsed state, national or international sporting championships or a School Sport Australia state or national championships. Closes 28th February 2014.

8. Elite Indigenous Travel and Accommodation Assistance Program (EITAAP) www.ausport.gov.au

The Elite Indigenous Travel and Accommodation Assistance Program (EITAAP) provides funding to assist with travel costs in the form of petrol costs or air travel and accommodation expenses only:

- up to a maximum of \$1,500 per financial year for eligible national championships; and/or
- up to a maximum of \$4,000 per financial year for eligible international competitions

9. National/International Sport Championships Program

www.sportandrecreation.tas.gov.au

The National/International Sport Championships Program provides grants of up to \$3,000 for national or international sport championships being held in Tasmania. Funding is distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to organisations meeting the eligibility criteria. To be eligible for funding, the championship event must be held between 1st July 2013 and 30th September 2014. Closes 28th March 2014.
