

#### **MAYOR'S REPORT**

As most of you will know Mayor Annie Revie has resigned from council owing to ill health. As the elected Deputy I have now been appointed Mayor until the next election in October. Councillor Rachel Summers is now acting as the Deputy Mayor and I look forward to working with her and the other Councillors over the coming few months. I would like to take this opportunity of acknowledging the important work done by Annie over the past four, years and to add that I, and my fellow Councillors, regret that she has had to leave but wish her all the best for a swift return to full health.

As a result of Annie's resignation, Council has appointed Mayor David Williams as the chair of the following committees:

- The Furneaux Group Shipping Special Committee:
- The Furneaux Group Aviation Special Committee;
- The Flinders Boating Special Committee; and
- The Flinders Council General Manager's Performance Management Review Committee;

and appointed Cr Aaron Burke to the Flinders Council General Manager's Performance Management Review Committee.

The big news is that we received a formal letter from the Deputy Premier, Michael Ferguson, advising us that the State Government will take over ownership and maintenance of the sealed section of Palana Road north from the airport to Five Mile Jim Road. Currently the State owns the road from the airport to Lady Barron, so the removal of this further section of road from Council's asset register will have a large effect on reducing the costs associated with our depreciation and ongoing maintenance schedules.

In addition, Minister Ferguson has advised us that the State Government will also take ownership of any additional sections of Palana Road that are sealed in the future, encouraging us to advocate to the Australian Government for funds to seal the remainder of the road. We will definitely continue to talk to the Government about this great opportunity.

As always we appreciate the Deputy Premier's support of the Furneaux Islands and their communities.

And more good news on roads. After Palana residents petitioned Council to reduce the speed limit in the Palana township to 40km, Council made application to the Commissioner of Transport on their behalf. We are happy to report that we have received notification that the speed reduction has been approved. New signs will be installed in the coming months.

Council welcomes Kyra Newman to the trainee Executive Assistant position within Governance. We are looking forward to working with Kyra and helping her grow in the role.

And lastly, congratulations to Noel Boland for 51 (long) years of devoted service to our various island's airlines. It's always been a pleasure to be greeted by Noel when travelling.
