General Manager's Column

Elections

The Mayor is unable to provide her routine column due to the regulations around election advertising and communications. As we are now firmly in election mode, the Community has the chance to hear what Councillors have achieved during their terms and what they, and new candidates, would like to achieve in the term ahead. With 12 nominees for some 7 positions and for the first time in many years, 2 candidates for Mayor and 3 for Deputy Mayor the Community has a broad range of people to choose from. The Tasmanian Electoral Commission will be sending out election forms in the coming weeks with the polling period running from the 14th to the 28th of October. Flinders often has the highest voter returns in Tasmania and I hope this year will be no different.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Councillors for their hard work, dedication and leadership. Few realise just how much time, effort and dedication performing the role of Councillor requires. The role of Mayor and Deputy Mayor even more so. I wish all candidates luck in the election and look forward to working with the Council chosen by the Community in the years ahead.

Roads to Recovery

The Honorable Warren Truss MP Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development wrote to Council late last week confirming the Federal Government's commitment to the Roads to Recovery program through to 2018-2019. Flinders has been allocated \$197,068 per annum during this time with 2015-2016 seeing a one off allocation of \$394,137. With a major road resealing program planned for this year, the extra funds provided will support this being expanded significantly in 2015-2016 and beyond.

Shipping:

As outlined in a householder last week, shipping to and from the Islands will continue under a 60-day trial of a new agreement between the State Government and Furneaux Freight.

Key to the deal was an agreement that secured a short-term, third party stevedoring service at Lady Barron Port.

The Tasmanian Government will release shipping contingency funds toward extra costs incurred during the trial period.

It should be noted that Furneaux Freight's statement made in the last edition of the Island News where they claimed Council had refused a development application near the Lady Barron Port, relates to an episode that occurred an estimated 12 years ago where the company at the time applied to rezone land for a depot below the hall area. Council approved the rezoning. No development on the site in question has occurred since.

Community Facilities

The planned renovations to the Emita Hall have now started with the builders in full swing. It is hoped this work will be completed in time for the Emita Sports Day in January (weather permitting). I would like to take this opportunity to again thank the Emita Hall Committee for their generous donation to the works planned on the Hall and their ongoing volunteer efforts.

Works have commenced on the upgrade to the Emita Cenotaph which includes a parking bay/drop off area with a path and handrail for easier access, installation of new seating and a general tidy up of the site. Planning has commenced for the Remembrance Day event which will be held at the Cenotaph on the 11th November 2014. This project has been funded through financial support from Flinders Council, Flinders Island RSL and funding secured through the ANZAC Centenary Local Grants Program.

The new BBQ and exercise equipment on the Whitemark Foreshore will be installed in November and plans to replace toilets at Yellow Beach, Killiecrankie and Trouser Point are progressing well.

A Structural Engineer will visit the island in the coming weeks to do an assessment on the Lady Barron Hall. Council has committed funds to the hall upgrade and the Lady Barron community is to be thanked for their assistance during the recent Lady Barron Hall Committee's community engagement exercise.

The Whitemark Civic Centre Forecourt project is well under way. Council staff are actively working with the architect, builder and Council Works Department to have the project complete and acquitted by the due date at the end of the year. This project is part funded by the State Government.

Tasmanian Government Funding

As part of the recently announced State Budget, Flinders was allocated the following:

- \$125,000 to improve telecommunications on the Island
- \$50, 000 towards tourism marketing initiatives
- \$50,000 towards the Flinders Trail
- Continuation of the Shipping Contingency Fund
- Ongoing Community Service Obligation payments to Hydro Tas to offset the cost of power on the island

Bass MP Sarah Courtney will be on the island on the 21st of November to publically announce the funding. Those who would like to attend please call reception at Council on 6359 5001.

Telecommunications

The ongoing issues with mobile phone coverage internet speeds and other related issues has been a matter of concern to Council for some time. With the assistance of Michael Ferguson the Minister for Information, Technology and Innovation, Council staff have been actively engaged with senior Telstra staff in developing a

telecommunications upgrade plan for the Islands. While still in development, I am heartened by the efforts of Telstra to not only recognise the problems but also put together a long term plan for solutions. Once delivered to Council for review, consideration will be given as to how best to implement and fund the plan with both the State and Federal Governments showing keen interest in the proposal at this early stage.

Quarterly Reports

The October Council meeting will see quarterly reports delivered by all Managers. These are a great way for the community to see all the projects Council is working on and how they are progressing.
