Bitumen Road Patching and Edging	Memana Rd
Drainage	Memana Rd
Mowing and Gardening	Mowing was undertaken in Lady Barron and Whitemark residential streets, parks and foreshore. Regular maintenance of the Rose Garden.
Town Maintenance	Regular ongoing cleaning and maintenance of barbeques and seating. Roadside signage repairs.
Building Maintenance	Regular ongoing cleaning of public halls, public toilets and gyms. Arrange to re-install doors at Lady Barron Hall. Repair leaks on Rose Garden Room roof. Various repairs at Duckpond building.
Vegetation Control	Isolated storm-damage tree-trimming and clearing-up on various roads. Isolated roadside spot weed spraying. Lagoon Rd tree trimming.
Waste Management	Transfer of waste from Killiecrankie and Lady Barron transfer stations to Whitemark. Scheduled attendance and coverage of waste and general clean up at Whitemark landfill. Construction of recycling bays in progress.
Quarries	Nil
TasWater	Weekly and monthly water testing. Several water-break repairs.
Airport	NOTAM in place for aircraft arriving from mainland Australia has been superseded by a national NOTAM from CASA. CASA inspection report received, and safety findings are being worked through.

	<p>Water damaged areas totally 570sq.m identified on runway 05/23. Rectification works in planning. Threshold lights require lifting on runway 05/23. Rectification works in July subject to weather. Obstacle lights on the five hills surrounding the airport were inspected and a report on the required work to the poles compiled. Commenced lopping of trees and vegetation around obstacle lights. Maintenance on RFDS hangar completed. Two 23,000L of Jet-A1 fuel received. Emergency Response Agency personnel – airport familiarisation training continuing. Airport terminal roof water-leaks repaired. Bureau of Meteorology conducted maintenance work of the airport’s automatic weather station. Construction of new private aircraft hangar commenced. Clearing of trees, preparation of parking area, and drainage works behind hangars. Mowing and weed spraying of grassed areas. Sweeping of both runways and main apron. Continued drainage upgrade works to all areas. Maintenance to aircraft grassed parking areas. Standby power generator fortnightly checks. Workshop cleanout and maintenance. Airport now operating in accordance with the new Aerodrome manual submitted as per CASA requirement for the new MOS 139 (Manual of Standards part 139). CASA surveillance audit conducted early May 2022. Maintain COVID-19 sanitizing and cleaning of Terminal, airport vehicles, workshop and Office.</p>
