

S-O6 Roadside and Road Reserve Vegetation Management Policy

Department Works and Services

File No. WOR/1500

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1 Objective

To maintain optimum driving conditions for user safety and to protect road surfaces, the environment and aesthetic amenity, through careful management of roadside and road reserve vegetation.

2 Scope

This policy covers all roadside and road reserve vegetation under council's jurisdiction.

3 Definitions

Outdoor staff - a Council Officer tasked with roadside and road reserve vegetation management.

Council - the Flinders Council.

Landowner – a person who owns land.

<u>Contractor</u> - a person or firm that undertakes a contract to provide labour or machinery to perform a service or do a job.

<u>Legislation</u> - any statute, regulation or rule for which Council has administration and enforcement functions and powers.

4 Policy

It is the Policy of Council that:

- 4.1 Vegetation is kept low and away from road edges to give good lines of sight on road corners, to allow guideposts to be easily seen and to allow maximum visibility of wildlife, thereby reducing collisions and minimising damage to persons and vehicles.
- 4.2 Vegetation is controlled to allow ample ventilation and sunlight to penetrate road surfaces, which are required to be kept as dry as possible to extend their condition and useable duration.
- 4.3 Roadsides will be maintained free of laden vegetation as a means of firebreak in the event of wildfire.
- 4.4 An integrated policy of vegetation control is used including slashing, trimming, tree clearing, herbicide spraying and steam weeding. The choice of vegetation control is determined by consideration of economic, environmental and health and safety



factors, the type and size of vegetation, as well as the minimisation of the spread of weeds, and the specific requirements of the site.

- 4.5 Rare and endangered species are protected as far as practicable and disturbance of vegetation in identified areas will be avoided as much as possible.
- 4.6 Rare and endangered species sites are not identified with signage. Only signage necessary for the direction, safety and guidance of road users is placed within the road reserve.
- 4.7 Privately owned trees that protrude onto Council roadsides will be cut back for sight distance or safety reasons, and the work will be done at the cost of the landowner.
- 4.8 Planting of any species of tree or shrub on roadsides is not to be carried out without first obtaining the written permission of Council, and any trimming or removal of approved plantings will be done at the cost of the landowner.
- 4.9 Work Practices are planned and undertaken in a manner to stop the spread of declared weeds, non-declared agricultural and environmental weeds listed in the Natural Resources and Environment website and parramatta grass.

5 Procedure

This Policy should be read in conjunction with Council's Roadside and Reserve Vegetation Management Procedure and the Furneaux Regional Weed Management Strategy 2022-2037 and 5-year Action Plan.
