In the meantime, it was my honour and privilege to officiate at the Australian Citizenship Ceremony for Dr. Alex John, his wife Jenny and two of their daughters Olivia and Davia (their third daughter Heidi was born in Hobart). It was pleasing to see such a large number of their friends come along to witness the ceremony, enjoy a lovely morning tea and swap a few stories. Amongst the thoughtful gifts they received were a fly swatter and a jar of Vegemite!

At the last Council workshop, it was agreed that the five photographs by renowned Tasmania photographer, Peter Dombrovskis, donated to the Community by the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery, should be displayed in the foyer of the Flinders Arts and Entertainment Centre. They are wonderful photographs of Tasmanian wilderness which will make our foyer look a lot more attractive.

Council has some big issues to consider in the near future besides Telstra and the airport upgrade. Amongst the several challenges identified in the FTI Consultant's report into our island's future, was to note how critical it is for this community that we understand the probability that within seven short years our working age population will fall below the number required to maintain our essential public and private services. Please be aware that Council is treating this problem with urgency and is already looking at ideas to voung people to the Unfortunately, such a major issue takes time to deal with and has other problems involved too, such as housing, but we are, as they say, "on to it".

The deadline for the General Manager's vacant position expired on 17th November and we are very pleased with the quality of applications received. Councillors will be considering those applications this week and making a short list for interviewing as soon as possible.

I have recently returned from a couple of days in New South Wales and was appalled by the toll the bush fires took on small remote communities. It certainly should motivate this council to talk to the Tasmanian Fire Service as well as Parks to ensure that we have done our best to protect our own communities from such horrific disasters.
