WELL! WHAT AN EXCITING WEEK FOR FLINDERS ISLAND!

The visit from Senator Steve Martin brought us some amazing news! Senator Martin first visited Flinders Island to attend the Food and Crayfish Festival in 2018. He and his team enjoyed it so much, especially the CWA 'Taste of Island Products Lunch'! He returned twice since then and was lobbied by council staff and others regarding two of our priority projects. Behind the scenes in parliament, he in turn has lobbied for our community.

FUNDING TO SUPPORT THE WHITEMARK AIRPORT

We depend on our flight services, and of course our shipping services, to take our community members on and off the Island. We depend on both services to deliver our important freight. These services are our life-line. No-one would argue with that!

Senator Martin lobbied Michael McCormack, Deputy Prime Minister and leader of the Nationals, to provide funds for this wonderful place - and he was Last successful! Thursday, Steve announced \$1.8 million as a major contribution to the much-needed upgrade for our main runway. Without the upgrade, our airport would be unviable. Runways, for obvious reasons, have to be maintained to a very high standard.

We still have to find a further \$1.8 million – but now we have a huge head start. Massive thanks to Senator Martin for his supportive work. Watch this space for updates!

AND THEN THERE IS THE SAFE HARBOUR PROJECT!

The Safe Harbour Project has been a long time in the planning. One of the key purposes of State and Federal Governments is to provide funds for important projects around Australia. Projects are initiated by individuals and businesses, by local councils, by State and Governments Federal themselves. Providing funding is key to stimulating job growth, skills training, and for meeting goals, such as population growth.

SAFE HARBOUR IS A COMMUNITY INITIATED PROJECT

Chris Fenner and Andrew Thompson, working for a time with ex Councillor, Gerry Willis, were the force behind the project.

The project began in 2011 and they have been lobbying ever since. Council applied for federal funding last year but was unsuccessful. Now, because of Senator Martin's intervention, the project will be fully paid for.

WHAT IS A SAFE HARBOUR?

There is a constant stream of marine traffic between Tasmania and Mainland Australia. The Bass Strait is a dangerous stretch of water, in bad weather especially. A Safe Harbour is a location offering all-weather protection to mariners, especially small and medium-sized craft. If the weather becomes rough, these craft can find safety in protected waters. Usually there is a rock wall that offers protection from prevailing winds and waves. There are also marine berths to tie up securely, and toilets and shower facilities. Currently there is no safe Harbour between Eden and Triabunna. In the not-too-distant future there will be Flinders Island to make the journey much safer. Great News! Great future prospects! Well done Senator Martin and the Flinders Council and the Safe Harbour Working Party!
