# Badger Corner Bridge – last to be converted to concrete

The Samphire River Bridge at Badger Corner was opened to traffic on Wednesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of April.

I would like to congratulate the Works Department, who with past and present Councillors, committed to a program started in the 1990's to replace all wooden bridges, owned by Council, with concrete ones. The driving force was the desire to reduce the maintenance bill arising from the 30 wooden bridges on the Island. In March of this year the last wooden bridge was demolished on the Samphire River at Badger Corner.

### Cyclists, walkers and joggers sharing our roads

Flinders roads are not specifically designed for the traffic mix that now uses them; trucks, cars, bicycles, joggers and walkers. Safety can be improved if cyclists have an awareness/visibility of traffic coming up behind them, joggers and walkers face oncoming traffic, and motorists slow down when passing/overtaking either of the above groups.

The Island is becoming more popular for cycling holidays, thus motorists should be aware that the cyclists you meet may not be used to our road conditions.

#### 80 km on gravel roads - reminder

The maximum speed limit on ALL unsealed roads in Tasmania is now 80 km/hr unless otherwise sign posted. (Introduced 1<sup>st</sup> February this year).

A small number of signs are being supplied by DIER and will be displayed in strategic places such as on exit from the Airport.

Each individual unsealed road will not be signed for 80 km/hr.

As always be aware of changing conditions on our roads and reduce your speed accordingly.

### **Development Application Advertising**

All discretionary development applications must be advertised in a paper circulating daily in the Municipality. For Flinders Council that is The Examiner.

The time frames allowed for Council to assess a Development Application do NOT allow for Development Applications to be advertised in the Island News.

Development Applications, when advertised in The Examiner, are also placed in the notice board outside the Council Office entry door, on the property and on the Council website for the duration of the advertising period. Tasmanian planning law requires development application to be dealt with within 42 days including a 14 day period advertising for discretionary applications. The "clock" stops if more information is required from an applicant and only starts again when the complete requested information is received. This can make the perceived council processing time seem much longer than the 42 days. The applicant may be asked to agree to a short extension of time to enable the application to be considered by Council at its next Ordinary Meeting.

#### Fishermen's Memorial

Tasports will be placing the Fishermen's Memorial on the grassed area near the freight collection shed at the Port in Lady Barron. The Memorial was previously

displayed in front of the Marine Board Office and commemorates the lives of local fishermen lost at sea.

#### **Deal Island**

I had the pleasure of dining with the Friends of Deal Island as they passed through Flinders on their way to Deal Island for a two week working blitz. The group is passionate about the history of Deal Island. They are endeavouring to raise grant funds to restore the lighthouse. This trip they are doing work around the small museum, including the cataloguing of articles housed there. The aim is to have the catalogue accessible on the web at a future date. This small museum has a surprising number of visitors.

# **Support Local - if not local then Australian goods and services**

The Furneaux Group is somewhat isolated from wider Australia, but we still hear of the high number of job losses occurring Nationally. #### **GRANTS**

There are currently a variety grants available that may be applicable to local community groups and organisations. Below are a list of the grants and their links for you to have a look at. If you have an idea or project we suggest you contact the funding body to discuss your eligibility and application.

- 1. Aboriginal Benefits Foundation www.aboriginal.org.au/grants
  Grant Applications are considered by the board of the foundation at each directors meeting. The board currently meets approximately 6-8 times per year.
- 2. First Home Owners Grant (FHOG) and First Home Builder Boost (FHBB) www.sro.tas.gov.au Applicants can receive \$7,000 for the FHOG for a new or established dwelling including a house, flat, unit, townhouse or apartment anywhere in Tasmania that meets local planning standards. The existing \$8,000 First Home Builder Boost (the Boost) has been increased to \$23,000. The new Boost applies to eligible applicants with

contracts entered into between these dates 7 November 2013 and 31 December 2014.

# 3. Arts Tasmania Offers Funding Programs www.arts.tas.gov.au

There are a range of grant opportunities available through Arts Tasmania at different times throughout the year.

### **4. Tasmanian Jobs and Growth Plan** www.investment.infrastructure.gov.au

The Australian Government announced \$106 million in funding for the Tasmanian Jobs and Growth Plan, for projects which support the economic development of Tasmania. The Tasmanian Jobs and Growth Plan is an initiative which complements Government's Economic Growth Plan for Tasmania—a package of measures aimed stimulating Tasmania's at economy by supporting growth and employment.

### 5. Farm Finance Concessional Loans Scheme (Tasmania)

The Australian Government will provide \$15 million per year (a total of \$30 million over two years from 2013-14) for the provision of Concessional Loans to eligible farm businesses in Tasmania for productivity enhancement or debt restructuring purposes. In Tasmania, the Concessional Loans Scheme will assist farm businesses experiencing debt-servicing difficulties but considered potentially viable in the longer term.

# 6. The Tasmanian Community Fund (TCF) www.tascomfund.org

The latest general grant round opened on 8 February 2014. A wide range of projects which support children and young people; community wellbeing and life skills; community participation and recreation; connecting communities; and culture, arts and heritage are eligible to be funded by not-for-profit organisations proposing to undertake a project in Tasmania. Applications for small grants close on 2 April 2014 and applications for medium grants close on 16 April 2014.

### 7. Grants for Grassroots

We're also offering 90 Grant Packages to help community clubs. Each grant will include an equipment pack to assist with training and \$1,000 cash. One club in need will have their grant upgraded to a special **\$10,000 Super Grant.** Applications close 15 August 2014

# 8. Sport and Recreation Tasmania 2013/14 Grants Programs - www.development.tas.gov.au

Sport and Recreation Tasmania provides funding to increase opportunities for participation in sport and active recreation in Tasmania, and to assist the ongoing development of Tasmania's sport and active recreation sector. In 2013-14, funding will be available through five grant programs. Clubs, notorganisations for-profit and government entities that provide sport and active recreation opportunities to the Tasmanian community are invited to apply.

# 9. Community Council Grants Program www.calvarylenahvalley.org.au

The Calvary Community Council Grants Program assists Tasmania to build a healthier and happier community through support for events and activities that make a positive difference to society. Launched in 2004 with initial funding of \$100,000 the areas of focus are nutrition, early childhood, older people, and oral health and marginalised groups. Round 1 closes 30 April 2014, eligible 'not for profit' groups are able to apply for funding under this program.

# 10. 2014 Coles Junior Landcare Garden Grants www.juniorlandcare.com.au

Since 2008 the Coles Junior Landcare Garden Grants program has been providing grants of up to \$1,000 to schools and youth groups to help create gardens in their grounds or community, such as bush tucker gardens, water wise gardens or veggie gardens. All schools, kindergartens, daycare centres, and youth groups (e.g. Scouts) are eligible to apply for a Coles Junior Landcare Garden grant. Closes 2 May 2014

### 11. Community Heritage Grants -

The Community Heritage Grants (CHG) program provides grants of up to \$15,000 to community organisations such as libraries, archives, museums, genealogical and historical societies, multicultural and Indigenous groups. The grants are provided to assist with the preservation of locally owned, but nationally significant collections of materials that are publicly accessible including artifacts, letters, diaries, maps, photographs, and audio visual material. Closes 2 May 2014
