Vet Position-Good News

At a recent meeting, Craig Elliot from confirmed D.P.I.P.W.E to several Councillors and staff that the current arrangement involving John O'Dell's position Quarantine/ Bioas Security/Animal Welfare/private Vet would remain. John O'Dell will remain in the position and continue to provide a private Veterinarian service to our community in addition to his current departmental role. This is a great "win" for community, especially our primary producers and pet owners and I would like to thank community members who took the time to lobby our politicians and departmental staff and fellow Councillors and Council staff who were pro-active "behind the scenes". Mr Elliott stated that the Department didn't want to jeopardise the community's expectations and in fact an increase in funding will see renewed emphasis placed on the Bass Strait Island's Quarantine and Bio-Security issues. Our community will soon have an opportunity to have input into a new "Furneaux Islands Bio-Security Plan" that will clarify the issues and future direction of these important matters.

Coast to Coast Conference

Council's Community and Economic Development Manager, Jana Harper, was invited to present at the recent National Council's Australia Day Annual Conference "Coast to Coast". Jana's presentation highlighted the Indigenous and European history of the Furneaux Islands and activities that have taken place over the past few years in relation to the Furneaux Islands Festival that have attempted to provide opportunities to increase community inclusiveness and celebrate our unique Islands' culture and community. The presentation was fantastic and attracted considerable favourable reaction from conference participants and there was a lot of interest

and enquiries about our municipality as a result. I attended in my role as Deputy Mayor and would like to thank the Tasmanian Department of Premier and Cabinet for providing funding that enabled this to happen.

Emita Hall Update

It is great to report that stage one of the Emita Hall renovation and update has now been completed. Shortly committee volunteers will be re-painting the public toilet and kitchen areas. Quite a few exciting regular activities will soon commence in the hall. A huge thanks to dedicated Council staff, especially Jana Harper, and the local tradespeople who completed the re-roofing, re-cladding and re-lining renovation.

Whitemark Boat Ramp Upgrade

Council is currently waiting on a response from M.A.S.T re our request for a grant that would provide 50% of the funding to upgrade the Whitemark Boat ramp facility. The overall cost of this project is \$85,000 and Council has already committed \$45,000 to this important upgrade.

Lady Barron Hall Funding Success

An application for funding from the Tasmanian Community Fund for \$160.000 has been successful! Congratulations to the Hall Committee and in particular Fran Bryson and Judy Clark who put considerable time and effort into the application. The funding will provide a new kitchen and indoor gym space extension to the existing building. Council has committed funds to undertaking other upgrades and repairs to this important community facility.

Lady Barron Tip Closure

As many would be aware the Island's southern tip facility has now closed. A new transfer station has been provided off the main Lady Barron Rd. The requirements of the State's Environmental Protection Agency were the main reason behind the

closure and Council decided that to upgrade the facility would come at a considerable financial impost on ratepayers and, that given our small population, it would be preferable to focus any future financial costs on upgrading the Whitemark Waste facility.

Domestic Dog Issues

There have recently been more staff complaints to Council and Councillors re the number of domestic dogs on the loose, particularly in the Whitemark Township. The upcoming budget will contain increased fines. The State Dog Act contains considerable penalties and due to the total lack of responsibility by a small minority of dog owners, Council will now take a much stronger stance on issuing penalties. There will be no warnings or "turning a blind eye". Dog owners are reminded that ownership brings dog with it а responsibility to ensure that your dog is contained in a secure yard, has access to clean water, shelter and shade. If a dog is in a town area and out of its yard then it MUST be on a lead at all times. In areas such as parks, beaches etc. it must at least be under voice command, if not on a lead. If you see a dog on the loose please report it to Council staff and if possible take a dated photo. Remember that by doing this you are not just "dobbing in" an irresponsible owner but you may also be protecting the animal from coming to harm.

2015-2016 Budget Workshops

Council staff and most of your elected members recently participated in two days of discussions re next year's budget and projects. The formal decisions re the budget will form part of the Council Meeting that will be held in July 2015.
