Mayor's Report

Infrastructure:

The Australian Local Government Association February Newsletter states

"A significant proportion of Australia's local community infrastructure is at risk of disrepair - with an estimated \$27 billion of community facilities in need of significant renewal - and more Federal Government support is needed to restore them ..." Flinders Council, your council, has been proactive over recent years in maintaining and improving the Island's community infrastructure - the halls. the BBQ's, boat lunching ramps and recently upgraded toilets. Discussion on improvements to the showgrounds buildings will occur during the upcoming budget considerations for 2017-16. Flinders Council was also proactive in upgrading its bridges, completed Federal Government before acknowledgement of the need to support Councils in replacing bridges.

The big item for Flinders Council is the airport and the cost of replacing the long runway, the cost of which will be well above Council's own budget and Council has been lobbying both the Federal and State Governments for assistance in this area.

Stronger Communities Programme successful grant for Flinders Island:

Congratulations to staff member, Jana Harper, for the successful grant provided by the Australian Government for small infrastructure projects to improve local community participation, cohesion and/or contribute to community vibrancy and viability. The grant will go towards the purchase of a portable, removable stage that can be used inside or out, easy to transport, packs away neatly and can also be hired out. This stage will be shared between the Lady Barron Hall and the Emita Hall. Funds will also go towards landscaping/playscape garden at the Emita Hall.

Banking:

It is planned that Council will facilitate a Public Meeting for Bendigo Bank towards the end of February to inform the Community of the economic logistics of maintaining an Agency on the Island. Very briefly, to support the operation of an Agency deposits/investments of around \$20 million will be required. These are ordinary deposits that you might hold with any bank and we will be encouraging you to consider your finances and if you can support a local bank agency by banking with the Bendigo Bank. Off island ratepayers will also be asked for their support.

Please note the plan is for a normal bank agency NOT for a Community Bank.

Event Management Guide:

Council staff have developed an "*Event Management Guide*" which provides good basic information for anyone wishing to hold an event.

Reminding you also that the regulations for Place of Assembly licences have changed and these are now only required for gatherings with 1000 or more attendees.

The *"Event Management Guide"* is available on the Council website or by request from the Council Office.

School Holiday Program:

Thank you to all the parents, young people and volunteers who helped during the summer school holiday activities. This summer activities included a Boat Building workshop for the Emita Sports event; the Island Chef Cook-off Championship (the winning team was a team of visitors from the Meander Valley Leadership Group); Learn-to-Surf School - unfortunately this summer the swell and tides did not work for us and hopefully we can hold more of these popular classes next time; and dance/ comedy workshops with visiting performer Sean Choolburra. Sean's visit was supported also by FIAAI - thank you - and was a highlight of the program and provided great entertainment during the Furneaux Islands Festival events.
