MAYOR'S COLUMN

Airport and Road Works:

The re-sealing of Runway 05/23 (Short Runway) has recently been completed. The existing seal had reached the end of its serviceable life and required a two coat reseal to ensure it remains in an operational state, this is vital especially given the ongoing issues with the long runway. The works started early January by the digging out and repair of existing pavement failures in order to prepare for the reseal. The sealing works started on the 18th January and took 4 days (not consecutive) to complete, works were scheduled around flights to ensure minimal disruption to aircraft. The two coat seal consisted of a 10mm and 7mm aggregate coating and was overseen by Council's airport pavement engineer Simon Oakley, with the works carried out by the Council's Works and Service Department who worked extremely hard during this time. The end result is a quality reseal that should see the short runway remain serviceable and minimise any potential failures for years to come.

Stabilisation works are scheduled for the long runway and are due to be carried out from the 2nd March, it is anticipated that 5,000 square metres of runway will be foam bitumen stabilised, this will see current pavement issues addressed and minimise maintenance on those areas until such time as a long term solution is implemented.

In conjunction with the stabilisation works occurring on the long runway, Council will trial stabilisation of sections of the gravel on the Port Davies, Palana, Coast and Lagoon roads.

Some sections of the stabilised roads will be sealed.

Stabilisation is a process whereby the existing base material is agitated and infused with materials, and re-compacted to form a hardened base.

Council is financially able to undertake the roadworks trial due to the substantially increased allocation of Roads to Recovery funding for the 2017-18 years and the need to spend an increased amount of Council's own source revenue to receive the Roads to Recovery funds.

The proposal is to stabilise 5.5km metres and seal 3.5km metres of the stabilised section at a budget of \$446.000.

Council has \$455,000 Roads to Recovery funding allocated to it for 2016-17.

Requests for Service:

The "Service Request" process enables the tracking of actions taken to rectify the issues reported.

Tasmanian Freight Equalisation Scheme

The commonwealth scheme is applied to eligible goods being transported across Bass Strait and also for goods produced or manufactured on mainland Tasmania and shipped to the Furneaux Group or for goods manufactured or produced in the Furneaux Group and shipped to mainland Tasmania. Eligible claimants are those who incur the costs of shipping eligible goods.

The sea freight routes eligible for assistance are any port in the Furneaux Group and any port on the main island of Tasmania.

Vehicles, fuel, building materials and bulk cargo are some of the items <u>not</u> eligible under this scheme. Manufactured goods, such as furniture, primary produce, tanks, and much more can attract a shipping cost rebate. You can find a list of eligible goods in the <u>TFES Ministerial Directions - Schedule 1</u> on the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development website.

Tas Community Fund

Grant Round 34 of the Tasmanian Community Fund will open on 28 January 2017. Applications for small grants (up to \$20,000) will close at 5.00pm on 15 March.

Applications for medium grants (\$20,001 to \$90,000) will close on 5 April. Stage 1 applications for large collaborative program grants (\$100,000 to \$500,000) will close on 1 March. Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application in mid-June 2016.

Community Infrastructure Fund

The round for minor grants is now closed but for major grants the submission date closes at 5.00pm on 31 March 2017. Project expenditure must be over \$50,000. For projects with a cash cost of between \$50,000 and \$100,000 the amount of the grant will be no more than \$50,000. Larger grant amounts will require a minimum of \$1 cash contribution from the applicant for each \$1 provided from the fund.

New Building Regulations

As you may be aware, new building regulations came into operation on 1 January of this year. These regulations change the current way building and plumbing permits are issued and categorise work into "notifiable", "low risk" and "high risk" work.

Prior to arranging for building work to be done, a Building Work Enquiry Form is to be submitted to Council. You will then be advised of the category of your proposed building works and any subsequent requirements. The form is available from Council reception or website.

Please remember that all building works may still require a planning permit. If not, you may be issued with a planning exemption certificate.
