MAYOR'S COLUMN:

Roads & Gravel Supplies:

With the advent of some Autumn rain the works staff have been able to begin the task of grading our gravel roads and replenishing gravel in some areas. The Lughrata gravel pit is now operational having been purchased as a greenfield site around three years ago. Council now owns the two gravel pits, Lughrata (at Emita) and Cannes Hill (at Whitemark), providing a secure island gravel supply that enables it to undertake sheeting work on the Island's gravel roads in a more economic and practical way.

Please slow down, obey the signs and take care when passing through roadwork areas.

School Path:

I would like to commend Jacci Viney (Planning) and Brian Barnewall (Works and Services) for achieving the grant of \$50,000 from the Dept. of State Growth that enabled Council to develop and seal the path along the School Road making it much safer and easier to use for our young community members. Councillors' agreement to an increase in the capital works budget enabled the staff to complete the development and sealing of the path along Lagoon Road effecting the school to town connection.

Separately, Council will also extend the concrete path along Lagoon Road to link with this new sealed section as part of Council's township footpath upgrade program.

Housing Needs Analysis:

The State Government is undertaking a housing needs analysis for Flinders as a result of lobbying by both Council and FITBI regarding concerns for the lack of long term rental housing on the island. Meetings have been conducted on island and a survey produced. This work is ongoing.

Gunn Bequest:

Thanks to the generosity and foresight of Jack and Enid Gunn who made a bequest to Council to support the island sporting bodies in an ongoing manner, Council has around \$1650, which is 50% of the annual interest, to allocate to community sporting bodies. The remaining 50% being added to the principal to conserve the value of the bequest.

Applications close 20 April. Please refer to the Council website or apply at the office for guidelines and application forms.

Community Grants:

Each year, as it begins the budget process, Council opens its community grants process and this year the grant applications close on 20 April. Community groups interested in receiving assistance from the Council to support a project/activity they are undertaking for community benefit are welcome to apply.

The grants offered are not huge with a total of around \$8,000 allocated each year depending on the quality and value of the applications received. Again, refer to the website or the Council Office for guidelines and application forms

Local Government Elections:

The next Local Government Elections will be held in September and October of this year with all seven councillor positions becoming vacant. Voting is by postal vote and successful candidates will be elected for a four year period. If you are thinking about nominating, we would love to see you at a council meeting and there is an information session for candidates to be presented by the Local Government Association of Tasmania here on the Island on 31 May.

State Government Assistance: Bass Strait islands air travel concession.

A rebate of 50 per cent on the cost of one return trip to Northern Tasmania per financial year is available to age pensioners living on the Bass Strait islands who have a DHS or DVA Pensioner Concession Card.

The rebate is claimable through Service Tasmania.
