STRATEGIC PLAN 2031 RELEASED

UPDATE ON THE SAFE HARBOUR PROJECT

At the Ordinary Council meeting held on Tuesday 15th December, an update on the Safe Harbour Project was provided. The project is progressing well. Council resolved to award an Early Contractor Involvement contract, for the delivery of works required up to the submission of the grant application, to Bachelor Construction Group Pty Ltd.

POTENTIAL USE OF HOLLOWAY PARK

In recent months, Council has been in discussion with various stakeholders, including the Lady Barron Hall and Recreational Committee, on the potential staged development of Holloway Park for improved community benefit.

Currently the building at Holloway Park is used by the Flinders Lapidary Club only. Interest has been shown in future sharing of the facility for multi-functional use:

- Continuation of use by the Lapidary Club;
- Temporary use by the Furneaux Maritime History Association as an area to display artefacts that are significant to the maritime heritage of the islands;
- Possible staged development as an area for visitors holidaying with recreational vehicles / camper vans; and
- Use by the Tasmanian Fire Service as a staging area during emergencies and

where a future replacement shed could be built for fire vehicles from the southern end of the Island.

At the Ordinary Meeting on 15th December, Council gave 'in principle' support for TasFire Service to develop plans to establish a fire station, incorporating a training facility, at the Furneaux (Emita) Recreation Ground and at Holloway Park, Lady Barron.

Council also agreed to allow the Furneaux Maritime History Association Inc. to use the kitchen and adjoining room at the Holloway Park building, to house a maritime history display for a period of 12 months. The Association plans to find its own building in the future, but meanwhile, the Holloway Park building will enable display of maritime artefacts that speak volumes of the history of the islands.

COMPLAINTS REGISTER SHOWS IMPROVING CUSTOMER FOCUS

At the recent Ordinary Council Meeting, Council's Complaints Register was noted. Each time a complaint is expressed to the General Manager, it is recorded, dealt with and the outcome reported back to the Complainant. The Register showed a very manageable number of complaints from the Community, with each one addressed satisfactorily and reported back to the complainant. Of course, it would be wonderful if Council had no complaints at all – but, in the context of providing services to people, this is impossible. Council aims to be customer-focused and to work on improving its services continuously.

EXTENSION OF PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT TIME FOR WASTE MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

Council's Waste Management Strategy has been opened for public feedback. A few community members believed that a lack of time was given in which people could respond. Council believed it important that the Community engages with this very important aspect of Council services. As a result, the engagement time was extended until early January.

CALL OUT FOR INSPECTIONS

The document is scheduled for consideration by Council at its Ordinary Meeting, to be held on 19 January 2021. To provide time for the waste management strategy to be updated with any input from the Community, all submissions must be received no later than close of business on 6 January 2021.
