I AM AWARE THAT SOME OF THE ROADS NEED WORK

I am sorry that we are a bit behind on this right now. I wish it was not so. However, there are a few things I want to say:

- There has been a number of Council workers suffering ill health recently – the reason why the tip had to be closed temporarily for an extra day.
- Council management has had to do a fair bit of juggling to cover each service area, including roads.
- The Bowmans Creek Bridge collapse, followed by the washout of the detour has caused a big problem.
- Resealing of a few stretches of road had been started and had to be completed.

THIS COUNCIL DOES NOT SWEEP DIFFICULT THINGS UNDER THE CARPET.

The above are genuine reasons – not excuses. We are a small Council with scarce resources. There will be times when things are problematic and cannot be fixed at once.

PLEASE DRIVE TO THE CONDITIONS

Do not drive at speed: our roads are not made for speed. When the roads are under pressure, like now, it is vital that people drive even more carefully. Management is working hard to have things fixed as soon as possible.

IF YOU HAVE A COMPLAINT - DO THIS

Council is working hard to be service-focused. When you have an important issue here is what to do:

 Ring Council reception and report your service request or complaint or; Submit your service request through the Council website.

Every request is recorded and followed up. Issues are prioritised and someone will get back to you to let you know when your issue has been dealt with.

You would think, with all the Facebook Community Notice Board negativity in the last week, there would be complaints on the service register. There were two only! Of course, some people may feel angry when we have a period of things not going so well. Public blaming on the Facebook Community Notice Board does not help! **Please, people, do the right thing.**
