

NOTES FROM THE MAYOR

MEETING HELD WITH MEMBERS OF THE BOATING COMMUNITY

On Wednesday 26th May, Council met with members of the Island boating community. The aim of the meeting included:

- To let our boat users know that Council wants to listen and to work collaboratively, to ensure that Council-owned boat ramps are in as good condition as we can afford to keep them;
- To find ways of identifying processes to do the above.
- To identify how the \$120,000, committed by government in the lead up to the State election, will provide the best outcomes for boat users and the community.

It was a cold evening and yet around ten people attended. Thank you to these folks – Council appreciates your dedication.

It was generally agreed that working together would be helpful. Council suggested that a Special Committee of Council be formed, to be responsible for providing recommendations to Council on boat ramps. It was agreed that another meeting would be organized for late June to consider:

- A Special Committee of Council;
- An appropriate alternative.

WHEN A COUNCIL OWNS ASSETS, IT IS OBLIGED TO TAKE CARE OF THEM

Like other organisations, Council's accounts are audited. One thing the auditor general's office looks for is how Council is showing that it cares for its assets. Council's three halls, in Whitemark, Emita and Lady Barron, are examples of community assets that are in great shape – and yet, the halls are only used minimally. I want to encourage all sectors of the community to use the halls. Meetings, markets, judo, dancing, and more can happen in our halls. Simply contact Council to book.

COUNCIL DECIDED TO WITHDRAW ITS MEMBERSHIP OF THE NORTHERN TASMANIAN DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (NTDC)

NTDC was formed several years ago so that Northern Councils could work together to benefit the development (mainly economic) of the Northern Region. In the beginning all 8 Northern Councils were members. A couple of vears ago Dorset Council withdrew its membership. At the May Council Ordinary Meeting, Flinders Council decided to withdraw also. Our payment share, because we are so small, was around \$7000 per annum. The cost was one aspect of Council's decision. The main issue for Council, however, was that Councillors believe unanimously that NTDC is of little relevance to Flinders Municipality. One size does not fit all. The six member councils are all close to Launceston. They, and their communities, benefit from Launceston and its facilities. Also, being larger, they have similar issues one to the other. Flinders Municipality is small and isolated. Our issues and projects are very pertinent to us, but of little interest to the Launceston region. A recent example is NTDC held a forum to share projects of regional significance in readiness for lobbying for the next Federal Government Election. We have lots of projects of high significance to the Islands but of little significance to the region in general. We have much more in common with King Island. Both King and Flinders are small, isolated and have scarce resources - we cannot afford wastage. That wastage includes the time spent travelling to meetings that are of little importance to us. We cannot afford the cost, the time, or the energy. We will continue our collaborative efforts with King.

Many Hands Make Light Work!


Big thank you to the community members who came along on Saturday to sort cans for FIDHS Can 4 Cans project.
