I'd like to start by just pointing out, in case anyone isn't aware, the water around here in winter is very cold. I'm not talking about just a bit cool but freeze your bones in seconds kind-of-cold. I was surprised that there were so many willing participants in the Winter Solstice Splash – more than 50! It was an incredible turn-out and money raised went towards the school's fruit bowl program. A big thanks to Kristy Sullivan and her band of merry splashers for the idea and helping organise this event.

On Saturday 25th June, the Whitemark Community Gym Special Committee held a Trivia Night and what a great night it was. We had over 70 people in attendance. There was a last-minute MC change when our scheduled MC, Swaggy, had to pull out at the last minute. Justin Graham stepped up to the role with admirable enthusiasm. Some questions were easy, some hard, but the result was a tie between Squiz Games and King Quizzard. A best out of three Fantale Quiz showdown was the decider, with Squiz Games coming out on top. In third place came Trouser's Pointless.

All three teams who placed, kindly donated their winnings back to the Community Gym. We managed to raise over \$2000, which will go towards the design and construction of a new gym. The Flinders Island Sports and RSL Club has kindly donated a parcel of land to be the location of the gym.

On to some serious stuff. Most will know that in October this year the Local Government elections will be held. The State Government has now passed legislation to make voting mandatory. Voting will still take place by post, so it is crucial that the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) have up to date details for each person in our municipality. TEC has advised that the closing date for enrolments and updates is the 8th September. You can update your details online through the TEC website (www.tec.tas.gov.au),or pick up a hardcopy form from Service Tasmania or the Post Office.

If you are not eligible for the State electoral roll, you may apply for inclusion on the General Manager's Electoral Roll. This could be because you are not an Australian citizen, or you own property here, but do not reside in the municipality (e.g, land, holiday house, shop) or you are the nominated representative of a corporate body that owns or occupies land here.

You can contact Council on 03 6359 5001 to have the form sent to you or download it directly from the TEC website.

On Friday and Saturday of last week, Councillor Grace and I attend the Local Government Association of Tasmania's AGM and Elected Representative professional development training. It is always great to have the chance to meet with councillors from municipalities and discuss commonalities and solutions. Some issues others are dealing with are water tanks for new builds, short-stay accommodation and surprise, waste. There were sessions on the upcoming Local Government Review, workplace health and safety, strategic planning and dealing with personal attacks. There was a lot of useful information gleaned over the two days.

Whilst I was away, I was made aware of a tragic accident involving Megan Tulloch, a valued member of council's staff. I'm sure I speak for all of the Council team when I say how shocked and saddened I was to hear of Megan's accident and I wish her a speedy recovery. She will be sorely missed from our works team.

Lastly, one issue that people keep mentioning to me is that they feel Council is not communicating information to them sufficiently. We currently have this column in each Island News, plus Council's Facebook page, a monthly newsletter, our website www.flinders.tas.gov.au and the Community Noticeboard (the one between the Interstate Hotel and Bowmans's - not the one on Facebook).

TSO (Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra) LIVE ON SCREEN

Tomasi Trombone Concerto (Full Concert)

A Furneaux Community Arts Event

French composer Henri Tomasi is not exactly a household name but he's revered by brass musicians for his expertly written music for solo and ensemble brass, including his Trombone Concerto of 1956, which pays homage to various idioms, including jazz and blues. Stepping into the spotlight as soloist is David Robins, TSO Principal Trombone, who describes the concerto as 'an exciting musical journey in which the power, warmth, lyricism and playfulness of the instrument are all on show.'

Respighi's picturesque Trittico Botticelliano opens the concert, while the second half features music by two American legends: Charles Ives and Aaron Copland. Central Park in the Dark presents a tapestry of sounds from the 'green heart' of New York City while the Suite from Appalachian Spring, one of Copland's bestloved ballet scores, is tender, tuneful and transcendent.
