

#### **ACTING MAYOR'S REPORT**

This month saw the start of the "Want a seat at the table" campaign, run by the Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT), Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) and our State Government. Flinders Council is hosting an information session with LGAT on 23 August for anyone who might be interested in running in the upcoming election – please email <a href="mailto:governance@flinders.tas.gov.au">governance@flinders.tas.gov.au</a> if you would like to attend. There is also online training available that gives a good overview of what the requirements and expectations are of a Councillor, as well as how to run for Council.

Just another reminder that voting is now compulsory for local government elections. If you need to enrol or update your details with TEC, you can do so https://www.tec.tas.gov.au/Info/Enrolment.html For those not eligible to be listed on the Electoral Roll for this municipality (e.g. nonresident property owner, non-citizen etc) you can apply for inclusion on the General Manager's Roll, by contacting Council. Changes or updates to either roll must be done by 6pm on Thursday, 8th September.

It's that time of year where Council sets the rates for the 2022/23 financial year. There has been significant increase in Capital Values (CV), the model under which Council currently charges rates. This is across the state and country as property prices have risen astronomically over the last year or so. At the Council meeting on 16th August 2022, Councillors resolved to change our rating model to the Assessed Annual Value (AAV) which has had less movement than the Capital Values. This should reduce the impact of the Office of the Valuer General's new valuation adjustment factors.

Also adopted at the meeting was the Annual Plan, which spells out what Council plans to achieve in the coming financial year. It is against this plan that Council's budget, user fees, rates and strategic objectives are decided. It is one of

our most important documents alongside the budget which was the third job on the list for Councillors at the meeting.

The Ordinary Council Meeting Agenda comes out on the Thursday prior to the meeting. If you have any questions or comments about the motions, recommendations, or reports, get in contact with one of your Councillors. We are here to represent the community so let us know your thoughts.

I don't know about you, but I certainly feel as though I have boarded the express train to Christmas - we have Lions market, elections, show, Cabaret, School Gala Night, Sports Club Family Day, markets again, Santa coming to town and before I know it, I will have eaten too much turkey and have no room for pavlova.
