Did you head out to one of the incredible events during the Furneaux Islands Festival? There was so much to do - Twilight Market, Growers and Makers Market, Social Circus School Holiday Workshop, Music at the Tavern, a great big Community BBQ and for the first time, the inaugural Islander Portrait Prize.

It was great to see so many locals and visitors alike taking part in the many events on offer. Our Council staff, FIAAI and volunteers spend months bringing this event to you and I look forward to what they plan for our 2024 festival.

It is a busy time for Council over the next month or so, starting this week with a visit from Deputy Premier Michael Ferguson. We will host the Legislative Council and Premier in mid-February as well as a delegation from TasWater to formally open the new Henderson Dam.

Part of the visit of the Legislative Council includes a public reception where members of the community can meet and chat with the Legislative Council. This will take place on Monday, 20th February from 4:15pm to 5:30pm at the FAEC. Hope to see you there.

Waste – the least glamourous subject that anyone could write about – except for maybe sewerage. The State Government introduced a Waste Levy payable from the 1st July 2022, Council now pays for every tonne of waste that goes into landfill, at a fee of \$20 per tonne. This will increase to \$65 per tonne over the next few years. Council currently has an integrated waste management system as one of our Priority Projects. Should our advocating be successful we will be able to implement processes that will see very little actually end up in the ground with most being recycled, reused or composted.

Just to end on something more cheery, in March we will be unearthing the time capsule. Sunday March 19th is the big day and more details will be coming out in the next few weeks about the event. Put it in your diary!

FLINDERS ISLAND FOOD NETWORK

The Flinders Island Food Network is a group of passionate locals who care about local food production. The group sprouted from the regenerative tourism project, The Islander Way.

"The Islander Way project seeks to work with the community to identify, co-design and incubate innovative, place-based, and community-driven projects."

Over the past eight months, the Network has had several workshops and meetings led by the Islander Way team, with community members sharing their thoughts, feedback, concerns and vision for opportunities around local food production and supply. A small group have continued to meet regularly and are now known as the 'Edible Core'.

The group has designed a survey to understand what quantities of fresh fruit and vegetables are currently grown on the Island.
