

#### **MAYOR'S REPORT**

Last week was a whopper for Council with the Legislative Council of Tasmania and Premier Jeremy Rockliff descending upon us for a few days of meetings with Council, community groups and organisations. The General Manager and I were able to share some of Council's current and priority projects with them and community members were able to attend a community reception to ask questions, say hello and enjoy a few nibbles.

On the same day, the TasWater Henderson Dam project was officially opened by George Theo, CEO of TasWater, Premier Rockliff and Deputy Premier, Michael Ferguson. It is great to see the project, that was delayed by COVID finally completed and whilst we embrace many of the challenges of living on an island, it's good that water restrictions are now a thing of the past.

Later in the week, I met with Bridget Archer and Linda Burney, Minister for Indigenous Australians, again taking the chance to discuss our current and priority projects, our issues and opportunities.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Wednesday, 22nd March, Council resolved to undertake a number of maintenance tasks at the Whitemark boat ramp, including:

- Extension of additional fenders to 300mm of the seabed;
- Extra two fenders and one ladder on the end of the jetty;
- Access ladder on the boat ramp side of the jetty and handrail included;
- White rubber strips on all the fenders;
- An appropriate life saving device; and
- Rubbers on all of the jetty, with fittings to be stainless steel

Funding for these will come from a grant of \$120,000 received through Deputy Premier Michael Ferguson.

Also at the Council meeting, Councillors voted in favour of using the Open Space Contribution funds for conservation and preservation works on the G.W. Wolff Anchor located outside of the Whitemark Library.

Lastly, at a closed council meeting (due to commercial requirements), Council instructed the General Manager to negotiate a contract with the preferred tenderer to undertake stabilising works in line with the half yearly revised capital budget and to manage stabilising works for the State Government. This means that the roads that have been of concern to the Community, such as Lady Barron Road and Lackrana Rd just near the Whitemark Tip, will soon be addressed.

March 8th is International Women's Day and Council is hosting a luncheon at the Sports and RSL Club with a keynote speech by Angela Driver, CEO of Tasmanian Leaders. Chef Liz Leigh is whipping up some tasty delights and the bar will be open. If you haven't already bought your ticket, do so now!!




If you have an item addressed to you, it can be collected from the Flinders Arts and Entertainment Centre on the day.
