EARLY LEARNING INITIATIVE

The Early Learning for Three Year Olds (EL3) initiative is one of the first steps towards achieving the Tasmanian Government's commitment to provide access to early learning for every child in the year before kindergarten.

Following extensive engagement with families, service providers and community members across Tasmania in March and April this year, five Tasmania communities, including Flinders Island and Cape Barren

Island, have been selected to establish trial early learning services for three-year-olds in 2024 to meet local community needs.

This initiative is built on collaboration and inclusivity. The development and execution of the program will be a joint effort, involving parents, community members, and experts in early childhood education and care. Unlike a one-size-fits-all approach, this initiative will be tailored to meet the unique needs of our diverse community. The anticipated launch is set for 2024.

A productive session took place on Tuesday, 17th August, where we delved deeper into our aspirations for the early learning service. We explored who could operate it, days and times of attendance, and more. To ensure that this initiative truly represents our needs, a dedicated working group will be established to finalise the specifics. Over 50% of this group will consist of parents from our community – a rare opportunity for direct community involvement in service design.

Stay tuned for more updates on this remarkable journey as we pave the way for accessible and tailored early learning experiences that truly reflect our communities' needs.
