

The Islander Way, a state government funded project focusing on tourism through a regenerative lens, continues to make waves even after its conclusion. Sammi Gowthorp, Council's Community Services Co-ordinator, has been invited to present at the Local2030 Islands Network conference in Hawaii at the end of April.

Sammi will showcase the Islander Way as a case study of regenerative tourism. Her presentation will delve into the project's inception, the political and community support, as well as the challenges faced, and valuable insights gained.

The community is proud to have one of its own representing them on the global stage, with the costs generously covered by the US Government. We extend our best wishes to Sammi for a successful presentation!

In ongoing Council news, various projects are underway, some of which are partially supported by grants, while others are fully funded by grants. Among these is the long-awaited vet facility, which has been a Priority Project for several years. Thanks to an election promise of \$980,000 from the 2021 State elections, significant progress has been made. A portion of these funds has already been allocated for an x-ray machine, which is currently in use, and for the design of the vet clinic and associated structures.

However, during the tender process, it became apparent that our initial cost estimates were significantly below market rates thanks to the rapid increase in inflation. Rather than abandoning the project, Council has actively pursued additional funding support. It is important to note that this project is beyond the scope of Council's standalone financial capabilities, residing firmly in our Priority Projects list—a compilation of community-benefitting endeavours that require external funding. Annually, the Council conducts a Community Survey to gather feedback on our performance, strategic plans, priority projects, and to gather ideas from the community. This feedback is instrumental in guiding future plans and initiatives. Keep an eye out for the survey in May, providing everyone an opportunity to have their voices heard.
