### HOW IS EVERYONE COPING?

What a strange time we are in! I have found it quite hard to consider that the whole world is experiencing this coronavirus outbreak. People all over the world are the same as we are: social distancing – some feeling lonely if they live on their own; staying indoors unless it is essential to go out – many possibly experiencing levels of cabin fever.

For me it seems that I have totally lost track of time. Most days I don't even remember what day it is! The meeting I was part of online last Thursday seems only like yesterday. I find meetings online much more challenging than face-to-face. You can't see body language and it can be quite difficult to hear at times. On top of that, I find I have to concentrate so hard. Last Thursday I had a Council Workshop online, followed by attending an online FIBI Board meeting as Council Rep. At the end of the day I was utterly exhausted.

### TASMANIA SEEMS TO BE GOING WELL

All the signs, at last, are that Australia, including Tasmania, is doing very well. There is a drop in the number of new cases of the virus in every State. I listened to our Premier's broadcast yesterday – there had been seven new cases in the previous 24 hours, all in the North West. As I write on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April, it looks like the numbers are going down. It is wonderful to think that there is even a tiny light at the end of the tunnel.

It is absolutely critical that we do not become complacent. Transfer Stations at Lady Barron and Killiecrankie are still open. It is preferred that waste be taken directly to Whitemark Tip when possible to save double handling.

### Lady Barron Transfer Station

Council will now be able to accept green waste at Lady Barron Transfer Station as fire permits requirements have now been lifted for the Furneaux area.

## Whitemark Landfill

Due to concerns for our staff's workplace safety and the current COVID-19 situation, our workers will no longer be handling household waste streams by baling. We ask all tip users to please continue to separate their waste but will be instructed (at a safe distance) to dump household rubbish over the edge of the landfill as happened in the past.
