Community Shed

On Sunday the 26th October it was my pleasure to open the Community Shed which has found a home at the school based in the woodwork room.

It is a credit to the small band of determined and dedicated proponents of the Community Shed that the issues involved in housing such a voluntary community group in an education department facility have been overcome. Council has supported the group with funds for the purchase of tools. A great opportunity now exists for community members to develop their wood working skills in the company of like-minded friends each Saturday morning.

Arts

There was a vibrant opening of the exhibition of contemporary art by nine local artists, The Argonauts, at the community gallery. This exhibition is really worth a visit, the floating jelly fish will amaze and invite you in to view the other masterpieces.

Shipping

The 60 day interim arrangement for stevedoring is working well and discussions are being held towards the longer term arrangements.

Water

TasWater is a company owned by the Tasmanian Councils and has been setup under state government legislation to provide Water and Sewerage services to Tasmanian towns at the same price to users state wide. Upgrading the Whitemark and Lady Barron water

supplies to supply potable water falls under these arrangements. Works will begin in the coming year.

Strategic Planning

One of the first projects for the new council will be to collectively discuss and work through a process where a new long term vision for the Council and the community can be put in place to guide Council's efforts over the coming term. The Furneaux Futures project will begin in late December and go through January with a series of community engagement and consultation events in the planning stages as we go to print. Council will use the information that comes out of this project to set a new Strategic Plan and then work plans, budgets etc for the coming years to focus our efforts on working towards the goals of the community for the future. Council will use the Island News, our website and householders to keep you all informed and stimulate debate as the project begins in the coming month.

Some initial ideas and challenges to encourage debate could be:

- 1. Flinders needs a larger population to enable sustainable supply of health and education services and expand employment opportunities. What do you envisage as a long term target permanent population for Flinders? Is it 1200, a figure that has been used from time to time? Is it more, is it less? How best could we as a community encourage more people to move, live and work in the islands?
- 2. More work opportunities are needed., Many of these will need to come from new enterprises, innovative approaches to existing resources and/or existing businesses expanding and employing more people. How can we as a community encourage the creation of greater investment and jobs growth?

I look forward to keeping you all informed as the project commences and ask that if you are interested in being involved to talk with your Councillors about your ideas, goals and aspirations for the islands into the future and engage with the project when it begins in earnest in the coming month.
