Councillor Gerald Willis thanked the hard work of the former Chairperson, Mary-Anne Roberts, and the voluntary work of the previous Committee members of the Health Committee over the last term and reiterated the important role that volunteers have, and the contributions that they make, to our community.

Discussion ensued on the importance and value of continuity of membership for the Committee in the next term and additional organisations that could be approached for membership to the Committee.

Business arising from previous minutes:

Tasmanian Health Organisation – North - Consumer Register

John Loudon spoke on the role of the Tasmanian Health Organisation – North - Consumer Register. Promotion of the Consumer Register has been promoted via Council’s online community noticeboard and the noticeboard in Whitemark and flyers left at both the Doctor’s Surgery and the MPC. John spoke about additional promotion work that can be done via the MPC as a direct approach to past patients and visitors.

Carol Cox congratulated Angela Smith on the work that she has put towards the new Health Promotion board now located in Whitemark promoting the Consumer Register and other community health opportunities.

Physiotherapy Equipment

John Loudon is currently compiling an asset register of all of the RFDS donated equipment to the MPC and exploring whether the equipment will need to be used or dispersed in the future. John also reminded the Committee that this equipment had been funded by the Australian Government (through the RFDS and Tasmanian Ambulance Service) to be available for rehabilitation services conducted by DHHS physiotherapy services.

Further discussion by members followed on the fragmented health funding streams that deliver physiotherapy and other health services to Flinders Island.

The Committee resolved:

“The Committee recommends that the Mayor, on behalf of the community, write to the Federal Health Minister, c.c. (carbon copy) to the State Minister of Health, advising of the numerous physiotherapy health funding streams delivering these health services to the municipality resulting in fragmented physiotherapy services and a lack of continuity of these services. The result is potentially an excessive wastage of funds on flights as opposed to these funds being provided to services that are delivered to the community. This may also be the case with other health services.”

RFDS – Interstate Visitors

Discussion by members on opportunities to alert interstate visitors, and residents enrolled to vote in another State other than Tasmania, on their ability to access the air ambulance (RFDS) service if needed. Unless residents are enrolled to vote in Tasmania, or hold health insurance that

covers this service, charges for accessing the air ambulance will apply. This is also the case for visitors if they do not hold travel insurance.

This alert will be added to the Council New Resident’s Kit which is currently being updated and the Mayor in her Island news column.

Defibrillator – update on progress

The Committee resolved to recall the Motion from the October Meeting and that the current Chairperson contact the Lions Club to ask about the status of this project. Discussions continue on acquiring additional defibrillators for Flinders Island.

Tasmanian Association of Hospice & Palliative Care (TAHPC)

Gerald Willis briefed members on a meeting he attended with Christabel Alliston from the TAHPC. Christabel highlighted activities that could be useful to the Flinders community around grief and loss, life journeys and end of life education including information on advance care directives. There is also scope for particular projects that community members see as addressing some of the gaps in end of life journeys through seed funding grants.

Currently, Christabel is working with Wendy Nash to explore a possible art project on Flinders Island in cooperation with FIAAI to remember Gina Green.
