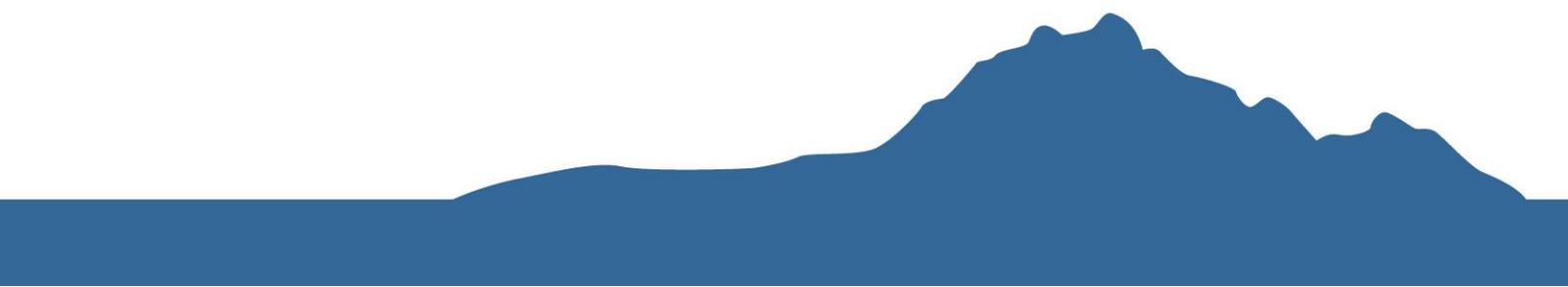

INTRODUCTION

The Northern Tasmania Development Corporation (NTDC) is currently funded by seven northern Council members, of which Flinders Council is one member. Amongst their stated aims is “to facilitate significant improvement in prosperity in the North and North-East Tasmania.” The NTDC was established in February 2017 “to achieve the targets set out in the Northern Regional Futures Framework and is committed to move to a new era of collaborative, innovative and sustainable economic growth in the region.” In general terms, the NTDC identifies ways to “continually boost economic output, increase investment, create more jobs, and to raise average wage levels.”

OFFICER’S REPORT

At the July and August Council Meetings, Council considered whether to pay the annual contribution or subscription fee for NTDC for the 2020/21 financial year, as well as a contribution to the Population Program for the same period. At the August meeting, Council passed the following motion no.158.8.2020:

“That Council pays the 2020/21 Northern Tasmania Development Corporation annual contribution to the sum of \$7,595.”

Following this resolution, there remains the matter of continuing membership of NTDC. The rationale behind membership of NTDC is that it works on behalf of the seven northern councils, funded by their collective contributions, on agreed programs to the mutual benefit of the councils from within the northern region. The strength of any subscription or contribution-funded organisation is the relative, and in some cases subjective, collective value or benefit to individual members, as compared to what they could potentially achieve individually.

Council’s previous Members Agreement (the agreement) with NTDC concluded in June 2020 and a new Members Agreement for 2020-2023 has been received (Annexure 4.1.1). Given that Council’s current resolution specifies the payment of the 2020/21 year only, and the agreement is for three years, there is some potential conflict between the Council decision and the term of the agreement. There is no current NTDC mechanism for less than a three year membership without an NTDC Board resolution. Membership of NTDC confers voting rights to each Council. In the event of a specific Council requesting for a single year of membership, an appropriate motion would need to be approved by both Council and the NTDC Board.

Meander Valley Council is currently pursuing an NTDC resolution to approve a one year membership, per the following resolution passed at its June Council Meeting:

“1. Approves Council committing to the Northern Tasmania Development Corporation (NTDC) Members Agreement for the three year term of the Agreement (2020-23) but with a twelve month review provision.”

In order to progress this matter, a more specific motion is requested to clarify Council’s intent with respect to the three year Members Agreement and annual subscription payment.
