<u>Mayor's Column</u>

Place of Assembly Licence

As reported in The Examiner and the Island Views, Launceston City Council has voted to stop charging Not For Profit groups the applicable fees for Place of Assembly Licences. Your Council, Flinders Council, has effectively been doing this for sometime. For the 2012-13 year to date \$780 in fees has been waived for community groups, with advice being given that a waiver of the fee will be considered by the General Manager upon request. Specific event—Place of Assembly Licences (PoA), as required by Tasmanian Legislation, provide protection for the organiser of the public event as well as those who attend. Council Staff will assist the applicant through the application process and assist with logistics for the event so that it may be enjoyed safely and without hassle by all. With the introduction of the new WH&S Laws and Regulations on the 1st January 2013, the penalties for an "accident" are high and volunteers are not exempt. If you are holding a public event (advertising the event to the Public) it is in your best interest to obtain a PoA, as evidence that you have actively considered the safety of the persons attending the event. Flinders and many other Council's Environmental Health Officers (EHO's) have been asking for clarification on some aspects of the regulations for some time. The State is due to review the regulations and discussions will start at a meeting of Northern Tasmanian Development this month. Council has received confirmation from Mr Stuart Heggie, State Manager Environmental Health, clarifying that there has been misinterpretation of a letter from him to Cr Peter Rhodes; there is no magic number for mass in the Regulations and I quote:-

"...there is no definition of mass gathering in the PoA Guidelines nor is there a designated minimum number of persons to constitute a mass gathering. The reference to the Australian Emergency Manual Series for the Safe and Healthy Mass Gatherings was provided as a useful resource for planning for large events (in excess of 1000 persons) and implementing mass gathering interventions. However it should not be interpreted that only events with greater than 1000 persons require a licence under PoA Guidelines. is just one factor your EHO needs to consider before issuing a PoA licence."

The aim of the PoA Licence is to provide a safe venue for the public attending the event and for small events this is usually quite straight forward.

Council Electricity Costs down

This quarter – Solar inputs have paid for electricity usage in all council buildings, leaving only the Street Lighting to be paid for and Council is looking at ways to reduce this. The solar arrays have been installed from grant funds received, especially the Bass Strait Island Energy Project.

Workplace Health & Safety

A workshop was held to inform Councillors of the expectations and implications of noncompliance in the case of an accident under the laws that were introduced on the 1st January. Penalties will be consistent in all jurisdictions, and are based on the degree of fault/risk of harm. The implications for Staff and Council finances can be huge, should an accident occur and negligence be established. The General Manager is working with Staff to reduce the overall risks. Elected Members have an obligation on behalf of rate-payers to provide Council with the necessary resources to comply with these Laws.

Looking Forward

With farmers on the island facing a tough winter it is good to remember that there are good things happening such as:-

- the Abattoir slowly being upgraded, strongly marketing Flinders Island produce and increasing employment. The Kylie Kwong article in the Mercury gave high praise of Flinders Island produce after she had dined on the island.
- Furneaux Freight's new vessel "Captain Bill" completed and undergoing sea trials.
- Sharp Airlines strong support of the Tourism Association and the arts community encouraging visitors.
- 2241 individual visitors to Council's website in the three months to the 24th

Public Events

Members of the community are reminded that PUBLICALLY ADVERTISED EVENTS require a Place of Assembly Licence issued by Council under the *Public Health Act 1997*.

The event organiser is responsible for the health and wellbeing of those present at their function. Conditions on a licence may include provision of sanitary facilities, risk assessment and the availability of clean drinking water for example. These are general requirements that should be provided to members of the public that are invited to attend an event.

These requirements relate to any land whether it is owned by Council, Crown or privately. Events in Council halls, that have a current Place of Assembly Licence, do not need to address these requirements if respectful of occupancy limits.
