Planning

In the six months July – December 2013, fifteen development applications were approved including three new dwellings, four dwelling additions, four subdivisions and 2 garages.

Council Meeting

Initial approval was provided for an amendment to the Flinders Planning Scheme to rezone a portion of Main Street, Lady Barron from Road Reserve to Port Zone and approved a permit authority for security gates and signage within the Main Street road reserve.

Council also approved a change of use to Tourism (Guesthouse) in the Rural Residential Zone, with associated signage at Badger Corner.

Australian Small Islands Forum

Approved planning for the next Australian Small Islands Forum to be held on Flinders from the $22^{nd} - 24^{th}$ April 2015. The theme is to be Remote Solutions and ASN Events will be engaged as the event organiser to deliver the forum.

Policies

Adopted a revised Aviation Policy that is now open for public comment.

Approved the Citizen of the Year Award policy.

Health

Community Development staff have obtained funding from Tas Medicare Local of \$12,000 to implement a program similar to the recent actively ageing program.

Special Committee Activities

Ratified the membership of the Lady Barron Hall & Recreation Special Committee of Council appointing new members Tanya Maynard and Chris Murphy.

Supported development of a Flinders Island Service Providers (FISP) Network to bring together the many Primary Health Service Providers that are active on the island. This is an initiative of the Furneaux Health Committee to build cohesion and greater coordination of primary health care services on the islands.

Budget

Considered and approved the amended half yearly budget (estimates) for 2013-2014. The amendment included removing capital expenditure for road resealing this year due to unavailability of local blue metal supplies. It is expected that blue metal will be available later this calendar year. Due to OH&S requirements Council retired its sealing equipment 12 months ago and now contracts out the sealing to mainland contractors. In order to gain the maximum efficiency in bringing outside contractors to the island, the reseal program will be changed from an annual program to either bi-annual or tri-annual. Adjusting the program will deliver a greater amount of resealed surface for less cost and minimise the cost of mobilising equipment from Tasmania.

Other Activity

The 2nd Quarterly report (to 31st December 2013) on Council Operations was tabled and can be read on Council's website as Annexure 25 to the February 2014 Meeting Agenda.

Some points of interest from this report are:

Solar powered compacting rubbish bins have been purchased for installation at barbeque and popular remote areas and will be operational next quarter. These will minimise the amount of time staff (and machinery) required to visit these areas to empty often half full bins, will ensure waste is fully compacted before going to land fill and help to avoid birds and the like spreading rubbish in these areas.

Port Davies Boat Ramp has been completed. Signage will be installed in the coming month.

Meander Valley Council (MVC) have generously provided Flinders Council with funding towards 2 flight tickets for young people to attend the leadership camp Stepping Stones.

A casual Works Officer has been employed for roadside and quarry weed control and options are being explored for the contracting of roadside weed management.

Staff

Kim Hossack has moved back to Brighton for family reasons and I want to thank Kim for her support of the community whilst living mostly on Flinders. Kim will assist remotely and local staff are up-skilling to continue to provide a high level of service to the community and meet the large amount of compliance and regulatory requirements that Council has to deal with from the State Government.

Expressions of Interest - Drysdale Training Comes to Flinders!

Drysdale is exploring the possibilities of delivering two programs on Flinders Island in 2014.

The first is for existing workers in the hospitality industry. The program will be heavily subsidised by Skills Tasmania and is aimed at existing workers requiring further training, and recognition of existing skills. Units on offer could be: Customer Service, Food and Beverage Service, Café Skills, Accommodation Barista, Services and Guiding. This program requires part payment by employers or employees.

The second program would be a fee free program delivered over 6 months with visits from Drysdale teachers on a monthly basis. This would include units from; Food and Beverage, Guiding and Interpretation, Basic Cookery Skills, Event Management and Tourism. This project will culminate in an "Event on the Island". Age is no barrier. This program will explore what is special on the Island and look at "Eco tourism, Food Experiential tourism" Tourism, guiding participants to find the gaps explore possibilities for future tourism ventures and experiences. This will be a hands on program with assessment through participation.

Both programs will work collaboratively with the Council, FITA, business operators and residents of the Island. GRANTS

There are currently a variety grants available that may be applicable to local community groups and organisations. Below are a list of the grants and their links for you to have a look at. If you have an idea or project we suggest you contact the funding body to discuss your eligibility and application.

1. Aboriginal Benefits Foundation www.aboriginal.org.au/grants

Grant Applications are considered by the board of the foundation at each directors meeting. The board currently meets approximately 6-8 times per year.

2. First Home Owners Grant (FHOG) and First Home Builder Boost (FHBB) www.sro.tas.gov.au Applicants can receive \$7,000 for the FHOG for a new or established dwelling including a house, flat, unit, townhouse or apartment anywhere in Tasmania that meets local planning standards. The existing \$8,000 First Home Builder Boost (the Boost) has been increased to \$23,000. The new Boost applies to eligible applicants with contracts entered into between these dates 7 November 2013 and 31 December 2014.

3. Arts Tasmania Offers Funding Programs www.arts.tas.gov.au

There are a range of grant opportunities available through Arts Tasmania at different times throughout the year.

4. 26 TEN Grants Program

www.skills.tas.gov.au

The Program supports employers and peak bodies to increase the literacy and numeracy skills of Tasmanian workers (paid and voluntary). Applicants can apply for a grant of up to \$50,000. There are two levels of funding: Tier 1 \$5,000 - \$20,000 and Tier 2 \$20,001 - \$50,000. Applications for 2013/2014 funding round are open and closes on 27th March 2014.

5. Commonwealth Bank Community Grants www.commbank.com.au

In 2014, the Commonwealth Bank is pleased to be awarding \$2,000,000 in individual grants of up to \$10,000 to youth-focused community organisations across Australia. Applications close Friday 14 March 2014

6. Rural Education Australia Program - REAPing Rewards www.frrr.org.au

7. Farm Finance Concessional Loans Scheme (Tasmania)

The Australian Government will provide \$15 million per year (a total of \$30 million over two years from 2013-14) for the provision of Concessional Loans to eligible businesses in Tasmania for productivity enhancement or debt restructuring purposes. Tasmania. the Concessional Loans Scheme will assist farm businesses experiencing debt-servicing difficulties but considered potentially viable in the longer term.

8. Regional Arts Fund (RAF) Grant Round www.tasregionalarts.org.au

Applicants for the March RAF round have until Friday 14 March to lodge their application. Application forms are now available on the TRA Website. Please note that the forms have been modified from those used last year.

Reminder: The Quick Response Grants are open now as well. No deadlines apply to these grants.

9. The Tasmanian Community Fund (TCF) www.tascomfund.org

The latest general grant round opened on 8 February 2014. A wide range of projects which support children and young people; community wellbeing and life skills; community participation and recreation; connecting communities; and culture, arts and heritage are eligible to be funded by not-

for-profit organisations proposing to undertake a project in Tasmania. Expressions of interest for large grants close on 12 March 2014. Applications for small grants close on 2 April 2014 and applications for medium grants close on 16 April 2014.

10. Grants for Rural Communities www.frrr.org.au

The program offers at least \$400,000 per round in grants up to \$5,000 for projects and activities that offer clear public benefit for communities, with populations of 10,000 or less, living in small rural and remote locations in Australia, contributing to their development in social and community. Closes 28 March 2014
