### MAYOR'S REPORT

### ASIF 2015 - Cancelled

Council has cancelled the Australian Small Islands Forum 2015 scheduled for April 2015 on Flinders. The August Council meeting was the date set for giving the final green light to the forum and whilst the benefits of holding a forum are recognised, there was not enough direct sponsorship evident at that time to satisfy the majority of Councillors that Council would not be left holding a major bill after the forum.

### **Other August Meeting Outcomes**

- Agreed that the Council supported community celebration on the 2015 Australia Day Weekend would be held on Saturday the 24th January as a part of the Furneaux Festival to be held over the Australia Day Weekend.
- Received and noted the Fuel Price Investigation Report. Councillors will discuss the details of the report and possible actions at a workshop. The report can be found on the Council website as "Attachment 6: Fuel Supply Investigation Report, July 2014" to the August Council Meeting Agenda.
- Ratified the appointments of Mr. David Madden as Commerce representative and Mr. Scott Woods as the Livestock Agents representative to the Furneaux Group Shipping Special Committee of Council.
- Approved an exemption from the Council Tender process for the purchase of a second hand bulldozer within the budget allocation made in the capital budget for 2014-15.

As part of Council's operations Council frequently requires a bulldozer.

Typical tasks include gravel pit development and rehabilitation, compaction and covering of landfill cell at Whitemark Tip and vegetation removal on roadsides along with fire mitigation. Historically Council has hired a local bulldozer on an hourly basis. Following an assessment of the future operational and requirements and a cost comparison between the hire rates and a Council owned machine, the decision was made to purchase a second hand machine. Subsequently. Council made an allocation of \$150,000 in the 2014/15 financial year budget for the purchase of a used bulldozer.

 Approved a variation in the capital budget of \$21,000 to an allocation of \$71,000 for the purchase of a new excavator as opposed to a second hand machine.

Second hand excavators were priced from \$50,000 to \$70,000 with hours of use ranging from 700 to 2,500 hours. New excavators were priced between \$70,000 and \$73,000 and included a 3 year warranty and delivery to Flinders Island (an approximate saving of \$1,500). The excavator is smaller than Councils other machinery and is to be used mainly in the digging out and patching of the runway.

- Adopted the Fraud Prevention and Control Policy.
- Adopted the Communication between Councillors and the General Manager Policy.
- Noted the Councillor Resolution Report for August 2014.

#### **Audit Committee**

Council is expected to comply in full with the directives of the legislation that require each Council to have an Audit Committee with a paid Chair Person. The cost of supporting such an approach is estimated as \$20 - 30,000. Council has allocated the funds in the 2014/2015 budget estimates.

Council has adopted the approach that it will retain its current Audit and Finance Committee which has a volunteer community member and adapt its terms of reference to fit more closely to the Ministerial Orders. Other Councils are also having issues with the regulation and cost of implementation of an Audit Panel as required by the legislation.

### **Red Cross Centenary**

The Centenary of Red Cross in Australia is being celebrated this year. As part of world's largest humanitarian movement, the Red Cross Society is best known for their immediate response to natural disasters, their blood service, and their everyday work to help vulnerable people. For 100 years they have been making a positive difference to the lives of people in need every day and are worthy of recognition. In appreciation of support received from the local governments over the past 100 years, the Society is gifting Council a Red Cross rose and commemorative plaque.

#### **GRANTS**

There are currently a variety of grants available that may be applicable to local community groups and organisations. Below are a list of the grants and their links for you to have a look at. If you have an idea or project we suggest you contact the funding body to discuss your eligibility and application.

# 1. Small Grants for Rural Communities (SGRC) - www.frrr.org.au

Grants up to \$5,000 are available for projects and activities that offer clear public benefit for communities in rural, regional or remote Australia. Priority is given to communities of 10,000 or fewer. Not-for-profit community based organisations can apply for funds to support projects and activities that are contributing to their social and community welfare, economic, environmental, health, education or cultural development.

# 2. Sport and Recreation Tasmania 2014/15 Grants Programs -

Communities, Sport and Recreation Tasmania provides funding to increase opportunities for participation in sport and active recreation in Tasmania, and to assist the ongoing development of Tasmania's sport and recreation sector.

## 3. lan Potter Cultural Trust www.ianpotterculturaltrust.org.au

The Ian Potter Cultural Trust was established in 1993 by The Ian Potter Foundation to encourage and support the diversity and excellence of emerging and early career Australian artists. If you are an early career or emerging artist with an opportunity to further your professional development overseas, you may be eligible for a grant of up to \$7,000. Closes 9<sup>th</sup> September.

# 4. Commonwealth Scholarships Program

The Commonwealth Scholarships Program (formally known as the Commonwealth Learning Scholarships (CLS) Program) was introduced in 2004 to assist students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those from rural and regional areas and Closes 31 December 2015.

# 5. Tas Community Fund - www.tascomfund.org

Applications for small grants (up to \$10,000) will close on 10 September 2014. Applications for medium grants (\$10,001 to \$90,000) will close on 24 September 2014. There have been no significant changes to the eligibility and funding criteria.
