### Mayor's Column

Although as I write this, the last barge of aggregate (blue metal) has not yet arrived, I would like to recognise the work of Brian Barnewall and all involved in bringing in the aggregate. Especial appreciation to the businesses supplying the extra trucks to unload the barge in a timely fashion.

The primary reason for the importation of the aggregate - the works at the airport - are well underway. The Commonwealth has provided a grant of \$786,018 for works to be expended by June 30<sup>th</sup> 2015. The \$786,018 grant is for drainage, increased standing area and taxi way including access to the new RFDS transfer shed. The grant amount is to be matched by Council.

The airport is a certified airport and it is imperative that works there meet the required specifications. The first two barge loads contained aggregate to the specifications required for the airport work. The opportunity was also taken to import extra aggregate to enable the road sealing program, including work on the State Road between the airport and Lady Barron, to be resumed next summer.

In the longer term Council will be looking at ways to obtain aggregate crushed on island.

#### March Council Meeting outcomes:

- Planning approval was given for a guesthouse at Badger Corner, maximum number of guests 16.
- Planning approval was given for a 3 lot subdivision at West End
- A letter was approved to go to the Minister for Local Government advising Flinders will NOT be having discussions with any other council with a view to amalgamation. The reasons given in the letter relate to the remoteness and extra costs involved in being an island.

- Council will continue to buy in resources as and when needed and continue a peer relationship with King Island.
- The Third Annual Furneaux Festival was approved for the last weekend (23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup>) of January 2016 with a budget to be set during the budgeting process for 2015-16. Staff will update Councillors on the proposed structure of the festival prior to the budget process.
- Mr John Dick was appointed as the independent Chair of Council's Audit & Finance Special Committee and Ms Diana Droog was appointed as a community representative. Thank you to John and Diana for taking on these roles. Local Government Regulations now require Councils to have Audit Committees with independent chairs.
- Approved an extraordinary Community Grant application by RSL Flinders Island sub branch for \$6,000 to bring Cape Barren Island and Flinders Island residents together for the ANZAC Day Service to be held at Whitemark this year.
- Approved an allocation of a maximum of \$25,000 in the 2015/2016 financial year with the addition of the 2014/15 budget allocation as matching funds, if an application to the Marine and Safety Tasmania Recreational Boating Fund for the Whitemark Boat Ramp upgrade project is successful.
- Decided not to accept an invitation to participate in a Shared Services Arrangement with Brighton and other southern councils, considering the cost of travel and time to participate would offset any benefits derived. This will not affect the arrangement Flinders currently has with Brighton in purchasing financial and asset management assistance.
- A budget variation was approved to the 2014/15 Capital Works Program Budget to reallocate \$20,000 from the Airport Runway Upgrade in order to purchase a new broom for the Airport.
- Adopted the following Policies:
  - Travel & Accommodation policy
  - The Uniform Policy

- Elected Members Allowances and Reimbursements policy
- Accepted the following Policies for community consultation for 28 days:
  - Personal Information Protection Policy
  - Waiver of Fes Policy
