Mayor's Report

Fire Season:

As I write this the Furneaux Group has been spared of any major fires threatening populated areas. This does not mean we should become complacent.

If you live in the Lady Barron, Whitemark, Emita, Killiecrankie or Palana areas do you know where your TasFire Service designated safer place is?

The Tasmanian Fire Service has developed Protection Plans for all these areas and for the Corner on Cape Barren (Truwana) Island.

The plans can be found on the TasFire website which is also a good place to check to see if any current fires are recorded in the Furneaux Group.

Please remain vigilant, make use of the free gas BBQ's provided by Council, Parks and the Friends of the Patriarchs, and keep our islands safe from fire.

January Council Meeting Outcomes:

- Noted that 3 Development Applications were received during December of 2015, two discretionary and one for a permitted development.
- Approved the "Investment Policy", the "Code of Tenders & Contracts Policy" and a suite of "Operational Behavioural Policies" after rescinding Council's previous policies. No submissions were received during the public consultation period.
- Approved a changed "*Policy Manual Policy*" that streamlines the public consultation process on policies one submission was received.
- Approved Council seeking reappointment as a member organisation of the Tasmanian Economic Regulator's Customer Consultative Committee (the OCCC) for a period of three years and

appointed Cr Peter Rhodes to be Council's representative.

- Received the Second Quarterly Report on staff activity as aligned with the Annual Plan. This is a detailed document that provides the reader with a good understanding of activities that Council undertakes.
- Received the Councillor Resolution Report that outlines the activity to date on motions put forward by Councillors.

Waste Transfer Stations:

These are in place for your convenience for the disposal of everyday household waste, batteries, whitegoods, used oils, small amounts of metal and green waste. PLEASE DO NOT PUT BUILDING WASTE IN WITH THE GREEN WASTE.

ALL OTHER ITEMS NEED TO BE DISPOSED OF AT THE WHITEMARK TIP. The tip is open Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday of each week (not public holidays). Each day's opening hours are listed elsewhere in the Council Pages. Do the right thing and help keep Council's waste disposal costs and your rates down.

Unrestrained Dogs Owners

The owners of all unrestrained dogs on public streets, dogs in public premises and roaming dogs risk large fines. Council staff have and will continue to impose fines and impound roaming dogs when reported to them. You are also reminded that owners are responsible for any issues arising from their dog's actions. If all dogs are on leads when out and about the rate of incidents should rapidly decrease. If you have an issue with a dog that is "at large" or has caused a disturbance, please immediately report it to Council.
