Lady Barron Hall Upgrade:

The tender for the refurbishment of toilets and addition of an exercise annex has been let to VOS Constructions. The works are scheduled to commence the week beginning the 10th October, with the aim of completing the build within 12 weeks with site establishment beginning this week. All going to plan, the Lady Barron Hall will be back up and running early January 2017.

Rates:

Reminder to ratepayers that to avoid penalty interest your rates need to be paid by the 21st of October 2016.

Vandalism:

Council provides public facilities with ratepayer's funds for the enjoyment of all the Community. Unfortunately there are times when minor vandalism of these facilities occurs, often during school holiday periods. Please encourage respect of the facilities that are provided for your benefit and enjoyment.

Bendigo Bank Is Here!!

Much work has been undertaken in the space beside the Post Office since the Westpac Instore Agency closed on the 26th of September. It is great to have banking services continue with the same friendly and supportive personnel behind the counter. The Bendigo Bank Agency is operational with services ramping up as time allows.

When Westpac advised it was closing our only banking service Council put much work into first, encouraging Westpac to stay, and when that was not possible, proving to Bendigo Bank that there is sufficient business on the Island to support an agency. I thank the Community, both local and extended, for supporting the introduction of Bendigo Bank to the Island.

I am informed an official opening of the agency is being planned for November.

General Manager Recruitment:

Council is in consultation with the recruitment company Searchlight Group who are working through the recruitment process and have selected applicants for first round interviews. These will be undertaken over the next couple of weeks.

Meeting outcomes:

TasWater

With the commissioning of the new water systems in Lady Barron and Whitemark to supply water that meets the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines, there are some residences and other buildings where owners may need to or wish to change their plumbing systems.

Council will waive the plumbing permit fees for residents and business operators who wish to revert from a dual water supply to a single water supply for a period of 6 months after the Department of Health and Human Services has removed the Do Not Consume Notice and Boil Water Alert in each of the towns of Whitemark and Lady Barron respectively.

Policies

Council adopted the "Provision of Electronic Services – Elected Members Policy" and it is now open for public comment for 28 days.

Northern Tasmania Development (NTD)

Unanimously voted to support the change of NTD, the Local Government based entity in northern Tasmania, to a Council owned company limited by guarantee, with an independent board of directors that will be better positioned to influence economic growth across the north, including the Furneaux Group. The resulting company is to be named Northern Tasmania Development Corporation Limited (NTDC).

U-turns at the eastern end of James Street:

Council has had complaints of near misses when people undertake a u-turn at the intersection of Davies Street and James Street. I ask drivers to please be vigilant

when making u-turns on any of our streets, to indicate your intentions clearly and to be aware of other traffic in the area.

AgriGrowth Loans:

The State Government is investing a further \$10 million into its AgriGrowth Loan Scheme, which makes available low interest loans to assist with capital funding for agricultural projects that have a long lead-in time. The contact point is the Department of State Growth.
