MAYOR'S COLUMN

February Ordinary Meeting of Council:

In dealing with a short meeting agenda, Council:

- received information from its Special Committees. Planning activity for January was very light whilst a comprehensive report was received from the Flinders Council Audit Panel;
- considered voting support on LGAT motions;
- developed a submission to the TasWater consultation for 2018-21 pricing structure which included highlighting to TasWater the need to plan for the sewerage of Lady Barron; and
- approved the Public Question Time Policy and Procedure, with the Policy to lay on the table for 28 days for public comment. The procedure will apply as from the February Ordinary meeting.

Building Better Regions Grant application:

Council, with the support of Telstra and the State Government, has again applied to the Federal Government major grants program for funding to do a major overhaul and upgrade of the telecommunications service.

Council recognises the need to have an improved telecommunications service in the Municipality. Even though we have a vibrant and forward looking community, the low population makes it economically unfeasible for the service provider to complete the required upgrade to infrastructure. Council, the State Government and Telstra have committed funds to the project should the grant application be successful.

State-wide Planning Schemes:

The Tasmanian Planning Scheme State-wide Planning Provisions (SPPs) was released by the Minister for Local Government and Planning on the 22nd February. The 498 page document can be downloaded at:

The SPPs include the administrative, zone and code provisions and the requirements for Local Provisions Schedules (LPSs) that are to apply in the Tasmanian Planning Scheme.

Council staff now have the enormous task of drafting the Local Provisions Schedule (LPS) and applying the zones and codes in a manner acceptable to the Tasmanian Planning Commission (TPC). Once accepted by the TPC and endorsed by the Minister the LPS will combine with the SPPs to form the Tasmanian Planning Scheme that applies to the Flinders Municipality.

Although the SPPs came into effect on 2 March 2017 as part of the Tasmanian Planning Scheme, they will have <u>no practical</u> <u>effect until an LPS is in effect in a municipal</u> <u>area.</u>

Until all that happens the current planning scheme still applies.

Reporting on Related Parties Transactions: Reports for the Year ending 30.6.17 must include for the first time the reporting of payments between Council & Related Parties of Councillors and key management personnel (KMPs).

Related parties include family members who are close to the Councillor or KMP and who undertake or have controlling interests in companies or businesses that undertake transactions with Council that are not transactions normally undertaken with council by community members i.e. rates transactions not included.

Council staff will work on providing elected members with the detail and registry requirements to enable Council to comply with this reporting requirement.

Three Good Men:

Since writing my last column we have endured the unusual situation of losing three men who, during their lives, have made a significant impact on the Municipality, both in an economic sense and as very likeable gentlemen.

Over his lifetime on the Island Don Bailey developed a thriving garage and machinery distribution business alongside his farming enterprise.

Knud Andersen was a farmer and respected Cape Barren Island resident who for many years assisted Council with the maintenance of that island's roads when they were a council responsibility.

Max Quartermaine, a trusted pilot who was a pioneer of bringing fishing and tour groups to Flinders in charter aircraft over many years.

The ongoing impact of the contributions these men have made will live on.

Sincerest sympathy to their families on their loss.

Major Road Works:

During the week of Monday 6th March pavement stabilisation will be occurring on the **Port Davies, Palana, Coast and Lagoon Roads**. Please reduce speed and obey signs when travelling through the roadwork areas.

Some sections of the stabilised roads will be sealed. This trial is being undertaken to determine if stabilisation is an effective way of improving pavement surfaces and decreasing the volume of ongoing maintenance associate with gravel roads.

The road pavement stabilisation trial is occurring in conjunction with the stabilisation of a section of the long runway and is made possible through the increased Roads to Recovery funding grants from the federal Government. Carol Cox Mayor

New Funding Program for Primary Health Services in rural areas:

In December 2016 the Royal Flying Doctor Service Tasmania was announced by Primary Health Tasmania as the provider of certain primary health care services on Flinders Island.

The role of the RFDS will be to lead and coordinate services targeting people living with chronic conditions such as diabetes, dementia, heart and lung disease and mental illness.

RFDS 'will work closely with local GP's and other health professionals to provide coordinated care to people with chronic conditions and support them to stay healthy and out of hospital' said Mr Edmonson Primary Health Tasmania CEO.

RFDS, Council, and our local health care providers are currently working to establish these primary health care services that will encompass a rural health worker, an exercise physiologist and a mental health worker.
