I was fortunate to have to consider this question over the weekend. The Sports Club held a family fun time and free BBQ on Saturday 26th, Australia Day. I was invited to make a short speech, for which I felt very privileged.

So, on advice from a valued friend, I looked up what indigenous writer, Wesley Enoch, had to say about Australia Day. He does not want to change the day - instead he wants all people to both celebrate and be encouraged to feel their sadness. So, I told my own story of migrating to Australia in 1974 with my husband and twin five-yearold daughters. I told of the joy and sense of adventure in journeying to a new home - I also told of the tremendous sadness at saying goodbye to my family in Scotland, the weeping and wailing, the feelings of loss. I told of how my career and lifestyle changed so much for the better - but also of the dreadful homesickness that lasted for a couple of years. It took me almost 20 years to apply for Australian Citizenship - I recognised the obvious benefits of making my home in Tasmania, but I felt the terrible loss of leaving my homeland.

Now of course I would not consider moving back to Scotland – I love being Australian and I especially love Flinders Island. But the accompanying feelings brought a double whammy.

The human condition is like that. If we are lucky, we experience times of great joy – but how many could say that they do not also experience great sadness and loss.

This country of ours is a bit the same. It brings us joy much of the time – but some of the history since the first fleet is horrendous. Instead of pushing that history into the fog – I believe we need to look at it. So, on Australia Day – we should celebrate this wonderful nation of ours and especially this amazingly beautiful Island and its people – at the same time enable those with sadness to mourn.

I hope the 26th enabled people to do that. My thanks to Wesley Enoch for his wisdom and to my good friend for suggesting I look him up.
