Welcome to 2023! What an exciting start to the year we have had already. Last week we had three information sessions on fin-fish farming which were all well attended. It would seem that, as a community, we are still saying NO to the prospect of fin-fish farming in the waters of the Furneaux Islands. After our public meeting on fin-fish farming in August of last year, our Community were invited to make submissions to express their thoughts on the matter of salmon farming. A total of 275 submissions were received for the entire state, with 172 from the Furneaux Group. What a great response from our Community! Two of the information sessions showed movies that had been produced both locally and internationally showing the effects of salmon farming.

Sunday, 15th of January, was the launch of the inaugural Islander Portrait Prize. Over 40 works were entered to the exhibition, in a range of mediums from photography, painting, charcoal and even quilting! There is such an incredible amount of talent in our community, I am sure that judge, Rick Amor, had a difficult time choosing a winner.
