

### **MAYOR'S REPORT**

The Future of Local Government Review Final Report has been released and recommendation for Flinders Municipality is that of no change, stating "Flinders should likewise retain its own representation rather than be merged into a new North East council." This is great news for our community, and I thank everyone who took the time to write a submission, speak to a Councillor or otherwise engage with the process. We do have until the end of February to submit feedback on this report before the Minister of Local Government, Nic Street.

The report also has 34 recommendations around voluntary amalgamation, shared services. community engagement, rating and revenue, elected member conduct and capability. performance monitoring and continuous improvement, partnering with the Tasmanian Government and developing the Council workforce.

Some Councils have expressed an interest in, or continuing discussions around amalgamations, and the report recommended reducing the state's current 29 Councils to 15.

The report is available on the Council website, or you can visit the Future of Local Government website. The main report is a short 200-page document, though a 14 page summary is also available. Flinders municipality-specific information starts on page 124 of the main report. Once Council has had time to assess the information presented, we will likely hold some information sessions (in late January/early February) before collating our final submission.

Some may have noticed new yellow lines around the "pram ramps" in Whitemark. These are designed to clearly mark where people with wheelchairs, prams, or those who need level access can cross the road more easily. Please refrain from parking in areas marked with yellow lines to ensure accessibility for everyone.

There have been some changes within our development services department recently which include the option to discuss your (potential) development directly with Council's qualified Planner. This can be done via a 001 Form lodged at reception. Further details on the new process can be found on the Council website or drop in to the office where our staff will be happy to help.

#### **WASTE UPDATE**

#### Cash-4-Cans

Between August and October, Flinders Council successfully organised four Cash-4-Cans sorting events. These received support from 14 remarkable community members, some generously volunteering multiple times. Together, these events resulted in the creation of five bales of sorted aluminium cans, all of which have now been shipped off the island for recycling! The profits earned will directly benefit the Flinders Island District High School.

To further improve this initiative, Council staff cleared and relocated the stockpile of cans to the

concrete slab. This cleanup provided an opportunity to assess the quantity of cans awaiting sorting, revealing a total of 103 bulk bags and two small skip bins, estimated to be around 80 cubic meters of cans.

To close out the year and reduce this stockpile, we've arranged two additional sorting events:

- Saturday, 25 November 2023, from 10:00 to 12:00
- Wednesday, 6 December 2023, from 10:00 to 13:30

## **Recycling Hubs**

Since its launch, the Community Recycling Hub has successfully collected a total of 59.869 kilograms of eligible products. During this time, we received only 3 kilograms of ineligible items, accounting for just under 5% of contamination (predominantly non-genuine printer cartridges). Although our aim is to reduce this to 0%, this serves as a great starting point.

Here are the top five performing programs:

■ Battery: 21.311 kg➡ Cartridges: 18.017 kg

Nespresso Capsules: 7.177 kg

MobileMuster: 6.805 kg
Beauty & Skincare: 2.045 kg
