ENERGY EFFICIENCY GRANTS FOR SMALL AND MEDIUM SIZED ENTERPRISES

Small and medium businesses can start preparing applications now for energy efficiency grants valued between \$10,000 and \$25,000.

Up to \$41.2 million in funding will be available in Round 2 of the Australian Government's Energy Efficiency Grants for Small and Medium Sized Enterprises.

The grants can fund a range of activities to help reduce pressure on energy bills and lower emissions, including:

- upgrading inefficient technologies, such as replacement of display fridge cabinets with more efficient models, or gas cookers with electric equivalents
- improving space and water heating systems
- conducting energy audits
- installing energy monitoring systems.
