Advice was received that the funding, administered through Council, for Podiatry and Community Nursing would be continued for 12 months post the 1st July 2013.

The funding for the Healthy Islands Project will not be extended past 30th June but will be put into a bucket for Small Grants Funds. The Community Development Officer is working on a program of activities that could be suitable for an application to this funding.

SES

Council has received the Annual Report from the SES. Notably the 14 SES volunteers have given 212 hours to community activities, 1873 hours to training, 96 operational hours in search and rescue and 41 operational hours in attendance to vehicle accidents. This is an average of 159 hours each. On behalf of the Councillors and community, I would like to offer our appreciation to and thanks to these dedicated volunteers who are willing to assist this community in time of emergency, no matter how small or large.

The services of the volunteer emergency groups;- SES, Volunteer Ambulance and local Fire Brigades have become a part of the community fabric and we must appreciate the voluntary hours given by their members to keep us safe. Not just when needed but in the hours given to training to acquire the needed skills.
